RAIDER BOYS NOSED BY COUGARS

Devil XC Girls Grab 11th-Straight UC Title

Placing only two in the top-10, the 17th-ranked Westfield High School girls' cross country team got a strong enough effort from the remainder of its runners to capture its 11th-straight Union County championship at Warinanco Park in Roselle on October 31. The Blue Devils with a 46 total finished well ahead of the second placed Summit girls, who totaled 88.

The Blue Devils also have been competing without the services of two of their strong runners, junior Kathleen Salmon and sophomore Carolyn Harbaugh, who fractured her foot.

"We have a reconstructed team," said Blue Devil Head Coach Tom Hornish. "Theresa Murphy and Sarah Heitner have really stepped up."

Senior Sarah Mahran was the first Blue Devil to cross, finishing third with a time of 20:03 and teammate Erin McClellan came in sixth with a time of 20:54. Raider Lindsay Curry placed eighth with a time of 20:58. Blue Devils Michele Madorna at 21:06, Heitner at 21:19 and Murphy also at 21:19 finished 11th, 12th and 14th, respectively, and Melissa Richey at 21:23, Jackie Cusimano at 21:43 and Marty Tracey at 21:49 came in 15th, 17th and 19th, respec-

tively.

The most interesting situation, however, was the race for first between Elizabeth freshman Jessica Rodriguez and Governor Livingston Highlander Megs DiDario. Leading by about 15 yards with about a half of a mile remaining, DiDario drifted off course. Before she realized what she did, Rodriguez was far ahead and finished first with a time of 19:43. DiDario crossed second in 19:54.

With the Blue Devils winning every UCT for more than a decade, Hornish responded, "Our girls have set the standard for Union County cross country. I'm very proud of them."

Although there was a bit of confusion in the girls' race, the boys' race was a scorcher as the 15th-ranked Cranford boys burned the Raiders for the title when Cougar Brian Zuravansky out-nosed Raider Zack McGuire for ninth place. Cranford totaled 39 and the Raiders totaled 41. The Westfield boys finished fourth at 129.

Raider senior Bob Wallden asserted his county dominance by winning his second-straight title, crossing first with a personal-best time of 16:09. Brian Kopnicki came in fourth at 16:45 and McGuire finished 10th with a time of 17:07.

Schiller who completed nine of 12 passes for 174 yards and booted a 27-yard field goal in the first half - he finished 12-17 for 214 yards. The non-constant, however, was reserve halfback Kyle Baker, who filled in for the injured Kyle Adams and literally battered his way to a first-half touchdown (TD) and Travis Boff who also scored a first-half TD.

Baker finished off a four-play 51-yard drive with a three-run TD bash with 1:21 left in the first quarter to put the Raiders in front 7-0. Steve Williams had receptions of 23 and 24 yards during that drive.

Baker, who rushed for 116 total yards and had an 18-yard reception, refused to be brought down easily. He commented, "It's all leg drive. I kept the legs driving but, without the line, I couldn't have been able to get through."

Although having success on Schiller's complex draw plays, Baker admitted, "Usually Kyle Adams runs those plays. I was a little confused and I made a mistake on one of the plays, but it worked out for the best."

"We talk all week that the young guys should be ready to step in. Kyle can run and he did a great job today," expressed Ciccotelli.

Boff, who had six carries for 22 yards with an 11-yard reception, crossed the goal line on a three-yard slice with 8:21 left in the half, capping a seven-play 61-yard drive. Ray Williams had a 25-yard reception early in the drive.

With 2:42 remaining in the half, Schiller booted his 27-yard field goal.

The Raider defense was equally impressive as they limited East Side to just 16 yards rushing and a 41-yard pass reception in the first half. In the second half, East Side could add just 11 more yards rushing and 33 passing. Linemen Chris Feighner - 15 tackles - and Matt Loomis effectively plugged the middle. Linebacker Josh Finkelstein led in tackles with 16. Josh Wexler had 11, Chris Zidonik had 10, Pavoni made nine tackles and Brad Belford made seven.

"We played well today. I don't

think we played well defensively last week (against Plainfield) but we got back to basics," Ciccotelli pointed out. "They (East Side) do a great job offensively with a ton of formations but our kids lined up properly and did a great job."
