## Red Cross Chapter Posts Courses in Lifesaving

WESTFIELD — The Westfield/Mountainside Chapter of the American Red Cross has revealed its fall course schedule in lifesaving skills.

A Community First Aid and Safety class will be offered on Saturday, November 10, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. This full-day course will teach participants cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) for infants and children, as well as adults, plus basic first aid.

An Infant/Child CPR class is scheduled for Tuesday, November 13. To be held from 5:30 to 10:30 p.m., it will cover choking, breathing emergencies and CPR for infants and children.

CPR for the Professional Rescuer (infant, child, adult and two-person CPR) will be given on Saturday, November 17. Intended for individuals who respond to emergencies as job requirements, the course will be held from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.

An Adult CPR class will be held on Tuesday, November 27, from 6 to 10:30 p.m. Participants will learn how to deal with choking, breathing and cardiac emergencies. It will also include training in automated external defibrillation.

A First Aid Basics class will be offered on Thursday, November 29, from 6 to 10 p.m. Participants will learn how to check the condition of conscious and unconscious victims; how to recognize and care for life-threatening illness and injuries and

how to handle choking and breathing emergencies.

For those currently holding this certification but need renewal, a renewal class will be offered in December, or participants may attend a "challenge" class on Fridays. For dates and times, please call the chapter at (908) 232-7090.

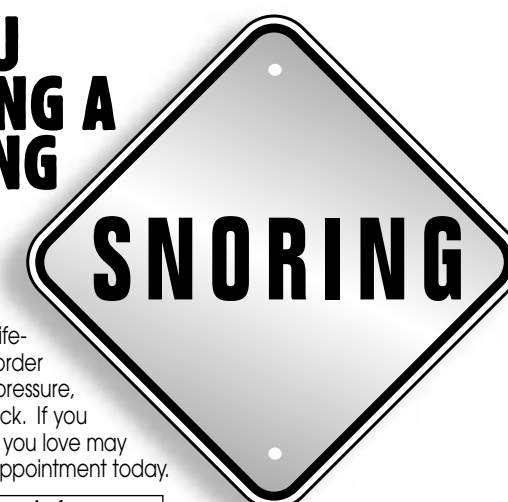
