fused to go down easily as he rushed 19 times for 141 yards and touchdown runs of two and one yards, respectively. At fullback Pavoni, who rested the entire second half, had a 45-yard touchdown reception and sophomore fullback Travis Boff gave it all he had to earn a four-yard touchdown run. "I love football! It's a hard thing to fill in for Kyle (Adams). He's such a good runner. It's a team effort and we all came through and did our job," said Baker humbly. According to Pavoni, "We call him Kyle Baker the touchdown maker." "It's basically the same thing. You've got to concentrate on your balance and use all leg drive. And the whole line did a great job blocking," added Baker. As the kickoff specialist, Schiller, aware of the speed of Pinnix and Stokes who lined up deep to receive the kickoff, began by bounding short kicks well in front of them. When Pinnix and Stokes moved forward to prevent the bouncers, Schiller banged the third kickoff into the endzone, keeping the Shabazz special teams in constant disarray. The Raiders marched 55 yards on eight plays during their first series, capped by Schiller's eight-yard TD keeper with 6:48 left in the first quarter. The TD was set up on pass receptions of 11 and 21 yards by wide receiver Steve Williams. With 4:25 left, after a 28-yard reception by Ray Williams, Baker bashed in from the two, upping the score to 14-0. Early in the second quarter, the

Raiders, on the Shabazz 48, had a three-yard rush by Baker. Schiller, on a broken play, hit Pavoni in full stride about 10 yards on the left sideline. From there, Pavoni rumbled like a runaway freight train to complete his 45-yard TD with 8:40 left in the half. The PAT missed to the right. "Brian sent me in motion on a naked play. They stopped the play on the end of the line so I went out to the flats where I was supposed to go and just sprinted down the sideline," explained Pavoni. Sticking totally to the ground, the Raiders chewed up 74 yards for the next TD where Baker blasted over from the one with 5:22 left in the third. A failed two-point conversion kept the score at 26-0. On the ensuing kickoff Raider special teams player Chris Sprague nailed Stokes on the 20, putting the Bulldogs in a hole. Next, Ray Williams and Josh Wexler inflicted a well-timed hit on a Bulldog receiver, causing the ball to fall harmlessly on the turf. On fourth down, Raider Matt Richards spotted a fake kick and brought the faker to the ground at the 16. Three plays later with 5:52 remaining in the game, Boff burst over from the four. With 2:57 left, Pinnix had an 18-yard set up on pass receptions of the Bulldogs only TD. Shabazz tried for the two-point conversion but Raider sophomore Anthony Bora brought Pinnix to the ground.

LAUREN CARAVELLO WINS BEAM Blue Devils Take 2nd In State Gymnasts

The Westfield High School gymnastics team, once again, placed second at the NJSSAA Championship in Old Bridge on November 9. The Blue Devils had a team total of 107.9, behind winner Red Bank Catholic (RBC) at 109.125. Last year, Toms River North totaled 109.925 to top the Blue Devils who had a total team score of 107.7. Westfield also placed second in 1999.

Senior Lauren Caravello, who won the state title in the uneven bars freshman and sophomore years, showed the rest that she was the best on the balance beam by winning the event with a score of 9.65, edging Gina Roselle of RBC who totaled 9.6. Lauren placed fourth in the vault with a score of 9.45, seventh on the uneven bars at 9.25 and tied for eighth on the floor exercise with Meredith Liscovitz of Immaculata with a score of 9.3 to finish fifth in the all-around with a total of 37.625.

Morristown finished with 156 yards rushing and no yards through the air. The march to victory came early in the first quarter, when Mercer and company began their assault from their 24-yard line. The Blue Devils gobbled up 76-yards on 11-plays that was concluded with Daly's two-yard TD. "We prepared all week. We came out hard and fought all game long," said Reavis. "We played our hearts out. We are a group dominated by seniors that have played together since PAL, so we wanted to go out there and win." In what was probably his biggest game of the year, the smiling and happy quarterback, Mercer said, "We stayed focused the entire game. We came out and played a great game. We knew they were going to come out fired up in the second half, but we had our adrenaline running high, understood what we had to do and did it." But the real story was defense. The Colonials were turned away time after time by the vicious Blue Devil defense. Junior defensive back Brian Butts led the Devils with 14 tackles, while Daly raised havoc with 13. Senior linebacker Matt Andzell punished the Colonials with 10, while senior end Matt Brinkman and Jenkins finished with seven. Senior safety Jay Cook was tremendous and was responsible for avoiding disaster, as he broke up a pass in the end zone, then responded with an interception, his sixth of the season, just one shy of a Blue Devil record. "Any ball that's up in the air is going to be mine," said Cook. "I don't care if it's Randy Moss going up for it. I am going to get it. We've wanted this since PAL. We wanted to go out and get it and we weren't going to be denied." The tough hard-nosed defenseman Brinkman said, "I had to work on

their tight end and tackle, which was quite challenging. We worked on that during the week, and we were able to stop the run. They run that veer option play which they run a lot on us, but we were able to stop that the whole game." "A magnificent effort," Blue Devil coach Ed Tranchina said. "It's all about effort, forgetting and putting yesterday behind you. We shut out that team, a great offensive football team. It was just tremendous! We tried to keep the ball on offense, away from them as much as possible, because offensively, they are very explosive. We got some first downs when it was crucial." Tranchina added, "Four years ago, it was the championship game in Giants Stadium when they beat us. They were somebody we wanted to model ourselves after. Coming up here twice to beat them was an extremely tough task for us. We have a lot of seniors. They in turn have a lot of underclassmen returning. My kids smelled this as their last shot, and they don't want the season to end, so we live to play again next week." The 7-2 Blue Devils will meet 9-0 Montclair in the second round on Saturday in Montclair.
