charged a ball about to be drilled by Raider Ryan Breznitsky after a fine pass from Terrence Charles. Cutro's best save came with eight minutes left in the half when he tipped a header from Raider Joe Bartolotta just over the crossbar. Arbitsman made a great save with slightly more than six minutes remaining, diving to his right to smother a shot from Anthony Bruno. Moments later, he made a wise decision to charge a shot from Hensal.

"I think Kevin is a great keeper. He has been playing with a bad ankle that has hurt his movement a bit. What I was really excited about was that Gil played sensationally. And that is what a team needs to know,

that nothing will change when another goalie goes in there," said Kapner.

The Raider offense has been notoriously tough on defenders but the introduction of a vicious flip throw in by Zazzali certainly has added another dimension of pressure. Just four minutes into the game, Zazzali made a perfect flip throw in from the right sideline into the left portion of the box where Miller drilled the ball into the upper left corner of the netting.

"We look for Eddie to throw to the back post and previously we haven't been getting people to the back post. Recently we have been getting people in," said Coach Breznitsky. "It's a helpful weapon and it's tough to defend against."

Early in the second half, the Blue Devils had their best opportunity thwarted when midfielder, Lee Tomasso's great shot was deflected by Simms. Later with 27:27 remaining, Hensal broke away down the right side and scored unassisted.

"The offense is coming around. We still don't have the greatest finishers but if we get enough opportunities, we are going to get a goal or two," said Breznitsky.

DASILVA MAKES GREAT SAVE

Crusader Boys Edge Soccer Vikings, 1-0

No longer is the Union Catholic High School boys' soccer team going to be considered a walkover by opponents. Caution must be taken. Although the Vikings may have lost a few games to some mediocre opponents, they defeated a dangerous Governor Livingston, 3-2, and, with the superb performance of junior keeper John DaSilva who had 13 saves, battled to a 0-0 tie with a strong Ridge team.

Without a doubt, the Vikings (5-6-1) have gotten a lot more competitive this year, taking several teams to the brink, winning some close ones, losing some close ones. On October 11, the A. L. Johnson Crusaders (8-4), last year's runner up in the Union County tournament, were tested but managed to get a goal off a deflection 1:09 into the second half when Mike Gaspar passed into the box to Shaun Griffin, who booted the ball off a Viking's thigh for the only score.

Viking Head Coach Joe DeOliveira, in his ninth year, commented, "I wanted to change the program around in a couple of years but it always takes more time than you think. Slowly, we are starting to get the real soccer players here, players who play all year round. Out there it is competitive, so I tell my kids that they have to play all year round."

Each team had only moments of offensive dominance and neither had

more than three dangerous shots on goal. DaSilva made a fine diving save to the left near the end of the first half. Not only did DaSilva, a junior, exhibit his fine agility in moving from left to right, but also, with his powerful left-footed kicks, he gained respect from Crusader Head Coach Al Czaya who cautioned his players to be aware.

"He was my sweeper and never played goalie before but I moved him to goalie because of his athletic ability," said DeOliveira. "He has been working a lot on his own. He has greatly improved."

Forward Pedro Gomes nearly put the Vikings ahead in the first half when his shot bounced off the post but the man Coach DeOliveira relies on to get the ball into the net is junior Paulo Olivera.

"We look for Paulo. He's my go-to guy," stressed DeOliveira.

Fullback Steve Esperon, especially during the final five minutes of the game, came up big with some stubborn protection of the goal area when the Crusaders made a sustained offensive surge.

"He's got a lot of heart. He's another person who started playing (soccer) only a few years ago but he has improved tremendously," DeOliveira pointed out.

"We are really working on getting more competitive. And we are getting a lot of support from the parents," concluded DeOliveira.
