GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 1617 AND TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF WESTFIELD, CHAPTER 33, TITLED "HAZARDOUS AND NON-HAZARDOUS WASTE, GARBAGE AND REFUSE" TO ADD A NEW ARTICLE VII CONCERNING THE COLLECTION OF SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLABLE MATERIALS.

Beglin, Jr., Assignment Judge of the Superior Court of New Jersey, Law Division, Union County, entered a Judgment in an action captioned Fanwood Disposal Service, Inc. v. The Town of Westfield and assigned docket number L-6856-93, declaring General Ordinance No. 1617 to be null and void as being pre-empted by applicable State law; and
WHEREAS, on May 10, 2001, the Governor of the State of New Jersey signed into law the Legislative enactment identified as "A1936," entitled "AN ACT concerning municipal solid waste collection and the collection of recyclable materials, and amending parts of the statutory law," which Legislative enactment has been designated as P.L. 2001, c. 92; and
WHEREAS, P.L. 2001, c. 92 authorizes the governing body of a municipality to utilize the collection of solid waste and recyclable materials to certain specified operating hours in order to preserve the peace and quiet in neighborhoods during the hours when most residents are asleep;
