Westfield PAL 'B' Crushes Chatham Gridders, 34-0

The Westfield Police Athletic League's "B" football team improved their record to 3-1 with an impressive 34-0 victory over Chatham at Kehler Stadium in Westfield on October 14.

The Blue Devils scored touchdowns on their first three possessions. Halfback Mike Venezia scored with a brilliant 64-yard run on the game's second play. Mark Anderson added the extra point. Tom Bonard scored the second touchdown on a 38-yard sweep around the right side. The extra point was successful on a quick pitch from quarterback Mark Boyd to Anderson. Sean Ferro added the third score with a 13-yard dash. Andrew Brunhofer, Terrell Shaw, J.T. Sheehan, Kevin Anderson, Daniel Nuber, Joey Schurig, Dan Melillo and Sam Crawford dominated the line of scrimmage.

The Blue Devil defense allowed only

one first down in the first half. Ryan Yarusi had seven tackles and Nick Delpopolo, Thomas Sheridan, Kyle Zeitounian, Jimmy Ponce, Mice Lawson and Ed Kane frustrated Chatham's game plan.

Head coach Pat Ferro dusted off the offensive playbook for Westfield's fourth touchdown. Quarterback Ferro pitched the ball to halfback Venezia who threw a strike to Peter Antonelli in the end zone. Peter Cornell added the extra point to make the score 27-0 at the half.

The Devil defense set up the fifth touchdown. Chatham attempted a fake punt but Yarusi teamed with Tyrell Simmons to drop Chatham for a huge loss. Joe Tressitt made a great 15-yard run and Anderson scored the TD on a counter trap. Bonard put in the extra point.

Andrew Gately made a great interception on the game's last play.

The Scotch Plains-Fanwood Jazz girls' inter-city soccer team completely outplayed the Cougar United, 3-1, in South Orange to pick their second win of the season.

The Jazz controlled from the start. Lauren Hercul made a rush up the right side and forced the Cougars to give up a corner kick. Briana Falco took the kick and set the ball in front of the goal. In a scramble for the loose ball, Jess McGarry alertly passed to a wide-open Kate Van Haasteren lurking at the 18-yard line.
