first half as a prepared and well-coached Kearny squad, led by quarterback Vinnie Abbott - 19 carries for 77 yards - put the Cardinals ahead 6-0 within the first two minutes when Abbott slanted in from the nine. Schiller answered seven minutes later, tying the score 6-6, when he found Williams streaking past the safety and laid the ball in his hands to complete the 76-yard TD.

Midway through the second quarter, Kardinal Pat Zdunek broke loose into the open field and sped 52 yards before being pulled down from behind by Ray Williams. With 5:10 left, Abbott scored on a 15-yard run and Bob Martinez added

the PAT to give the Cardinals a 13-6 lead at the half. "He had his team well prepared," said Ciccotelli of his Kardinal counterpart Matt Occhipinti. "They came out fired up. At half time, I told our guys that we have to play like we are capable. We played with more enthusiasm and emotion."

Opening the second half, Ray Williams scooped the kickoff on the 15, took a few steps toward the middle, hooked down the left sideline, then he left everybody in the dust. Schiller's PAT put the Raiders ahead, 14-13.

On their next possession, the Raiders (5-1) marched 78 yards to the end zone on six plays. After breaking loose for a 32-yard run, Adams slanted seven yards for the score with 4:38 left in the third quarter. Schiller's PAT kicked upped the score to 20-13.

On the first play of the fourth quarter Schiller capped a seven-play, 55-yard march with his one-yard sneak. With 5:10 remaining, Ray Williams boosted the Raiders' lead to 34-13 with his 37-yard end-around run.

With the victory well in hand, the Raiders' second-string offense - referred to as the Keystone Kopps by an anonymous individual - took to the field. On the first play without any blocking, Baker was flattened for no gain by three Cardinals. He got back up! On the next play, he battled his way 26 yards for the TD with just six seconds remaining.

The Raiders will square off with 5-1 Plainfield at Hub Stine Field in Plainfield on Saturday at 1 p.m.

The 9-0 Westfield High School gymnastics team extended its dual-meet winning streak to 40 by crumbling Old Bridge, 103.175-98.15, in Westfield on October 15.
