Westfield PAL 'C' Cracks Chatham PAL, 34-0

On the opening series, Westfield executed an eight-play drive capped off by an 11-yard TD run by Ryan Brand. Matt Shaffer burst through for the extra point. The Blue Devil defense never allowed Chatham to get started sitting them down after Joe Vall-Llobera dropped their QB for a six-yard loss.

Unscored upon in five games, the Westfield defense continued to enforce the pace by giving the ball back to the Devil offense after stopping Chatham every four plays. Multiple tackles were made by Austin Rolnick, Vall-Llobera, Ricky Ruhl and Eddie Simmons. Offensively the running lanes were opened with great blocking by Jeffrey Mysel, Greg Greifield, Anthony Cocuzza, Sam Crowell, Michael Hammond Alex Vanarelli and Tommy Wansaw. Michael Henry added a three-yard TD run just before the half. The extra point failed. On the first possession of the second half, Westfield engineered a nine-play drive ending with a nine-yard TD run by Shaffer. Henry ran in for the extra point. On the next possession, Simmons exploded over the left side for a 15-yard TD after a nice six-yard run by Jim Heffernan. Henry added the extra point. Westfield's last offensive series was quick with Henry going 27 yards on the first play for the TD. Shaffer added the extra point.

Bonard finished the drive with a six-yard TD run.

Defensively, Jack Trimble, Danny Dickson Jack Meagher and Steven Bigelow dominated. Davon Wise, Kyle Zeitounian, Zack Deegan, Andrew Gately and Mike Lawson made important tackles. Near half time, Joe Tressitt had an interception and Ed Kane recovered a fumble.

Opening the second half, Matthew Ince made three unassisted tackles in a row for a net loss of nine yards. Joshua Friedman, Andrew Brunhofer, Kevin Anderson, Jimmy Ponce and Yarusi allowed no first downs the entire half.

Bonard scored his fourth TD on a 35-yard run up the middle. Anderson added the extra point. The fifth TD came on a beautiful pass from QB Joey Simone to Ferro for a 53-yard connection. Four straight rushes by Peter Cornell, totaling 15 yards, resulted in the final TD. Anderson added the extra point.
