and did put seven points on the board with 5:43 remaining in the first quarter. Quarterback Mike Dollard rolled right on a fourth-and-six from the 14 and floated a pass into the hands of a leaping Hanif Davis.

By halftime, the Blue Devils amassed 50 yards in penalties to the Cougars' none and also lost two fumbles. Westfield did, however, get some redemption on an interception from senior Jay Cook and another from LaQuan McCoy.

In the second half, the Devils posed much more favorably towards the refs, accumulating only two penalties against Cranford's six. Finally, with six minutes left in the game, quarterback Louis Mercer connected to tight end Brian Butts for a 23-yard touchdown. Junior Andrew Lessner kicked the extra point to tie the game at seven.

A final Blue Devil run at the goal line with less than a minute left fell short, sending the game into overtime. Westfield took the ball first and marched down the field to the one-yard line. From that spot, Reavis skid into the end zone on a weakside run. Lessner added the extra point. On Cranford's possession, Cook intercepted Dollard's bomb to end the game.

Westfield's defense showed some brightness, especially Matt Daly, who tallied 14 tackles. Tri-captains Matt Andzell and Chris MacKay had six and five tackles, respectively. Cook picked off two Dollard passes while Daly and McCoy each had one. Cranford got a timely sack from lineman Tom Stanson and several strong tackles from Josh Harris.

Offensively, Reavis led in rushing with 49 yards. Tri-captain Terrance Jenkins rushed 24 yards, despite suffering a minor ankle injury early in the game. Cougars, Chaz Curtis, Pat Daly and Brendan Small amassed 112 yards on 39 carries.

Cook was sharp with his punting game, launching 50-yarders down field to Cranford punt return victims. Also, sophomore Jan Coccoziello played well in his first varsity game, returning punts for substantial yardage, especially a 17-

yard scoop up the right side in the second quarter.

The Blue Devils will be hosted by a rugged Linden squad this Saturday at 1:00 p.m. "If we don't play better, we're not going to have another win this entire season," Tranchina cautioned.

DEVILS SEEK 'EYE OF THE TIGER'

Blue Devil Girls Return Solid X-Country Core

Goal setting is what every high school coach does. Obtaining those goals is another matter, especially when those goals include matching or improving upon a spectacular 2000 season where the Westfield High School girls' cross country team had probably its most successful season since the program began in 1980.

The task at hand for the 10 returning veterans and Head Coach Tom Hornish is to match or better a team that earned the program its sixth-straight Watchung Conference title, 10th-straight Union County tournament (UCT) and extended its dual-meet unbeaten streak to 68. Additionally, the 2000 team won the St. Dominics Invitational, Shore Coaches Invitational "B" race, Group 4 State Sectional crown, placed third in the Group 4 meet and finished ninth in the Meet of Champions.

Seniors Erin McClellan, Jackie Cusimano and Sarah Mahran will be the "leaders of the pac" as team Tri-Captains. Other returning "pac" members are: seniors Martta McGlynn and Theresa Murphy, juniors Sara Ackerman, Michelle Madorma and Kathleen Salmon, and sophomore Carolyn Harbaugh. Hornish also indicated that senior Marty Tracey and junior Melissa Richey have been making "great strides" which could add valued needed depth.

Standout Alexis Anzelone, who has graduated, was the absolute "leader of the pac" last year. This year, according to Hornish, "the one who seems to have the 'eye of the tiger' mentality is going to be Sarah Mahran. She went to camp in Pennsylvania in late August along with nine other girls and she seems ready to make a move."

One interesting point of nostalgia is that talented sophomore Deenie Quinn's older sister Kristen competed on the original 1980 team.

"We've always had a tradition of a family continuity. It is quite neat that you have this continuity two decades later," said Hornish.
For many years, the Blue Devils have enjoyed the luxury of depth. This year, Westfield has 13 seniors, nine juniors, 11 sophomores and several strong freshmen, who could gain valuable varsity experience. That depth would be needed since the quality of teams in the conference and county has increased and could pose a challenge to Westfield's winning streaks. Although winning, the Blue Devils did get quite a scare from a surprisingly strong Union team last year in the UCT.

"Union is a very strong team. It's one of the teams in the county that could be problematic along with Scotch Plains," Hornish pointed out. "The key to our success this year is going to be a very strong pack. To improve upon last year is going to be quite an undertaking."
