## Canuck Gridmen Rout G.L. Highlanders 35-4

Highlander football fans will try to forget what occurred on September 22 in Berkeley Heights and look for brighter days ahead as they witnessed the North Plainfield Canucks roll over Governor Livingston, 35-4. Numerous Highlander offensive mistakes that included six turnovers and six sacks along with outstanding Canuck defensive plays made it a one-sided affair. Canuck Louis Smith amassed 129 rushing yards and scored four touchdowns.

The Highlanders had a good opening drive as they marched into Canuck territory at the 34-yard line. An errant pitchout on the next play resulted in a fumble that was scooped by Smith and returned to the G.L. 40. A few plays later, Smith veered his way for 13-yards and the TD putting the Canucks on the scoreboard 7-0.

After the Highlanders went three and out, the Canucks wasted no time as they struck on 12 plays amassing a total of 92 yards for a 14-0 lead. A

blocked punt later in the quarter gave the Canucks the ball on the G.L. 14-yard line where Smith scampered into the end zone to up the score to 21-0.

Late in the first half, disaster befell the Highlanders once more, as Smith rambled through a host of tacklers for 89 yards and the touchdown making for a lopsided 28-0 score. More of the same continued throughout the second half as the Highlanders failed to execute with any type of consistency with only more sloppy play. Canuck Smith later scrambled to the G.L. one then scored his fourth touchdown.

G.L.'s four points came on two fourth-quarter safeties. The Highlanders backfield remained and played tough showing remarkable poise and heart throughout the game. Senior Brian Dressel led the Highlanders offense with 48 yards, junior Marty Moroney had 33 yards and two-way outstanding player sophomore, Mike Fullowan, rushed for 24 yards.

Saturday, September 29 will be another tough assignment as the Highlanders travel to meet the Basking Ridge Red Devils.

## GOALIE MOSS RECORDS 11 SAVES Highlander Boys Rock R. C. Soccer Lions, 3-0

The Governor Livingston High School boys' soccer team improved to 2-1 by rocking Roselle Catholic, 3-0, on September 19. Junior midfielder Matt Sidie, sophomore Chase Golomb and senior striker Jake Dilorio each netted a goal. Sophomore keeper Jon Moss recorded 11 saves for the shutout.

"He can punt and throw the ball far and he's picking up more confidence and getting better every game," said Highlander Head Coach Bruno Somma of Moss.

The Lions' aggressive play controlled the ball during the first 10 minutes but the Highlanders answered with a sudden shift of attack as they began controlling the ball and the tempo. Accurate passes while stringing five, six passes together resulted in the first score as Dilorio chipped a crisp pass into Sidie who simply turned and blasted it past the keeper at the 10:40 mark.

The Highlanders maintained control while attacking from both flanks while driving the ball toward the net. Golomb did the rest as he scored at the 23:38 mark.

Somma, comfortable with his team's play, then opted to rest several of his front line starters. "We

have to look down the road to the more difficult teams, the games we need to win. So we need to remain healthy."

The Highlanders continued to control, making runs out to the outside combined with well-executed passes. The Highlanders found pay dirt for the third time when junior midfielder John Tully whistled the ball into Dilorio for the easy score.

After the game, senior forward Scott Donahue said, "The game was pretty much controlled by us. We stayed aggressive and our defense really picked it up, so it worked out pretty good."

Commenting on a long season ahead and how it may play out, Somma said, "I'm always looking at all of our seniors for leadership. When the chips are down, things that may not be going right, or anything else for that matter, I usually sit down with them and talk, getting some kind of feedback. It may be something that I'm doing or something that we as a team should be doing differently, always looking for improvement, so I'm looking for good things to happen by season's end."

Somma looks to seniors Justin Alboum (midfielder), Dilorio, Donohue, Jon Regenye (sweeper) and Amir Tadmori (defender) for that leadership.
