RAY WILLIAMS WINS 4, FERRARO TAKES 4 FIRSTS Raider Boys, Girls Tracksters Top Rival Blue Devils, 75-56, 69-53

In two very competitive track and field meets, Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School came out on top in both against rival Westfield on April 9 in Scotch Plains. The Raiders boys prevailed, 75-56 and the Raider girls won 69-53.

The Raider boys scored 53 of their points in the track events but the Blue Devils dominated in the jumps, 21-6. Raider Ray Williams came up big, placing first in all four of his events - 100 meters (10.3), 200 meters (21.2), 400 meters (47.3) and the long jump with a leap of 20'8.75".

The Blue Devil girls ruled the track events, 50-27, - especially in the middle and long distances - but the

Raider girls grabbed 26 of the 27 points in the throwing events and 16 of the 18 points in the jumps. Raider Jayme Ferraro place first in all four of her events - 100 hurdles (15.7), 400 intermediate hurdles (1:05.9), 200 meters 26.0 and the high jump with a height of 5'0".

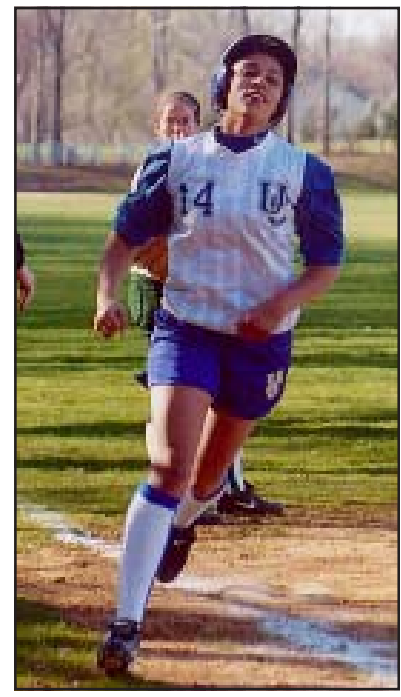

Lady Devils Get a 1st At Englewood Relays The Westfield High School girls' shuttle-hurdle relay team finished first with a time of 1:09.5 at the Englewood Relays on April 14 and ran just one second off the WHS record. Mika Cruz (16.5), Sarah Burke (17.1), Jessica Lee (18) and Lauren Solon (17.9) made up the winning foursome.

Ja'net Tiller (12.8), Burke (13.6), Jennell Carter (18.2) and Christine Pecoraro (13.2) finished fourth in the 4x100 at 52.8 and broke the WHS record. Tiller (26.7), Burke (28.1), Cruz (28.6) and Carter (26.7) placed sixth in the 4x200 with a time of 1:50.3, three seconds faster than last week at Kearny. Emily MacNeil (1:00.9), Carter (1:04.3), Cruz (1:04.4) and Anne Onishi (1:03.6) came in fourth in the 4x400.

Onishi (2:29.7), Deenie Quinn (2:34.3), Sarah Mahran (2:33.8) and MacNeil (2:21.6) ran just under the Penn qualifying standard in the 4x800, despite dropping the baton during the exchange (Mahran had to pick it up and re-hand it to MacNeil). With a time of 9:59.2, they took second to Hunterdon Central.

Raider Diamond Boys Rattle Cranford Cougars' Cage, 4-2

The hosting Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School baseball team took a huge step toward a successful season with a dramatic, 4-2, triumph over Cranford on April 10. Junior right-hander Dave Senatore's performance was simply sensational as he recorded nine strikeouts, seven hits while walking three.

Leftfielder Dave Baumwoll collected an RBI and went 4-for-4, including a double. Senior catcher Andrew Pavoni, who had three RBI, blasted a two-run double in the bottom of the sixth inning to seal the victory.

Referring to the outcome, Raider Head Coach Brian Homm said, "It was a great game all way around. Both teams played very good defense. Some really great plays were made. Both teams could have capitalized numerous times, but good defense by both teams shut the scoring down. Kyle Adams made that great play for us in centerfield in the fourth inning. Pitching wise for both teams, it was a close game, a fun game. It could of gone either way,

but we came out on top. Senatore did a great job for us."

The Cougars growled with both of their runs in the top of the first inning. Leadoff hitter Derrick Zulick reached first on an error then stole second. Zack Bribiesca followed and reached first on a bobble. With a runner in scoring position, catcher Dave Drechsel then ripped an RBI double to left. Senatore struck out a batter then hit the next batter to load the bases. Sam Chalhoff lofted an RBI sacrifice fly to give the Cougars a 2-0 lead.

The Raiders were held scoreless until the fourth. Marcus Dockery bashed a double to center and Steve Rodriguez reached first after the shortstop bobbled the ball. Kyle Adams stepped to the plate and blasted an RBI sacrifice fly to right, scoring Dockery.

In the bottom of the fifth, Baumwoll led off with a single and shortstop Chris D'Annunzio advanced Baumwoll to second with a beauty of a bunt. Pavoni then rifled an RBI single to knot the score.

In the sixth, third baseman Kyle Baker was hit-by-a-pitch. Baumwoll registered his fourth hit with a single to center. With two men out, Pavoni yanked his two-run double to leave

the Cougars speechless.

"We've been waiting for Cranford all year," said Baumwoll "We all pulled together, but I was impressed with a lot of the young guys who came through. It was just a real great and exciting game right to the very end with an incredible end."

"It was a tough game right to the wire," commented Pavoni. "But it was a clean and smart baseball game played by both teams. During the game, I kept telling Dave (Senatore) to remain focused and not to let up. So it's a pat on his back, because he makes great pitches when he has to, particularly in tough situations like the one today when they had a man on third and one out. He held him, so it was all on him."

A very satisfied Senatore commented, "In the beginning of the game it was kind of weird. Warming up in the bullpen, I threw a couple more pitches than usual. So I figured when I come in I would throw faster, but it didn't seem that way, particularly early on, then I kind of pepped it up. But my curve really wasn't under control until the later innings then I started getting command of it and the batters began standing flat footed."
