"She (Koscielecki) is running very strong. I would not be surprised if she split sub-57 by the end of the season," stated Koegel.

Koscielecki (1:08), Ferraro (1:08) and Michelle Reggs (1:15.6) took first in the intermediate hurdles with a time of 3:31.6.

Raiders Jones, Perrotta, Jenny Burke, and Aja Bundy finished second in the 4x200 at 1:49.5.

Chelsea Mintz, Jenna Balestriere, Liz Elko and Mary Shashaty took second in the distance medley with a time of 13:53.3.

The Raiders also took third in the shuttle hurdles at 1:15.3 and third in the sprint medley at 4:30.7.

In the jumps, Ferraro and Koscielecki took second in the high jump with a height of 9'4" and Jones and Perrotta took second in the long jump with a distance of 28'7".

In the field, Amanda Wells (27'1.5) and Kerri Quinn (30'7.75") won the shot put with a total of 57'9.25".
