

Meyer, Favro Set to Compete In USA Hockey Nationals

Alfred (AJ) Meyer and Tristan Favro, both age 15 of Westfield, and 18 fellow members of the New Jersey Rocket Tier 1 Bantam Major team, a youth hockey team, will travel to Colorado Springs, Colorado to compete against 11 other teams in the USA Hockey Tier 1 National Championships on April 2 through 7.

The team qualified on March 16 by defeating the Philadelphia Junior Flyers Youth hockey team, 2-1 and 3-2, in the best of three games, to become the Tier 1 District Representatives to the National Championships. Previously, the team won the Atlantic Youth Hockey League regular season championship.

Meyer plays defense and is a freshman honor-roll student at New Providence High School. Meyer was also a member of the New Jersey Rockets 2000 team that participated in the National Championship in Anchorage, Alaska. He was a member of the USA Hockey Atlantic District Select (ADS) 14 team and this winter was selected to play against the US Women's National Hockey (USWNH) team in Lake Placid, NY.

Tristan, the son of Graziano and Kathy Favro, plays goaltender and is a freshman at Princeton Day School (PDS) where he plays varsity for the Panthers. He is part of the Atlantic

District 1987 Select Team and was rated # 3 in the country for his age at the 1987 Select. This is his second time at the Nationals with the Rockets; the first was in Anchorage, Alaska. Tristan played the USWNH Olympic team four times with a special select team comprised of 1988's, 1986's, and one from 1985.

NJ Devils Youth Win Peewee Ice Nationals

Fanwood resident Henry Cox helped the New Jersey Devils Ice Hockey team win the USA Peewee National Championship in Colorado Springs, Colo. on April 7. The Devils overwhelmed the competition while posting a 6-0 record and outscoring their opponents by a combined score of 48-18.

The Devils have not lost a game since November and won the prestigious Silver Sticks Tournament held in Port Huron, Minn. in January. The winner of this tournament is allowed the distinction of being called the best peewee team in North America (including Canada).
