Miller-Cory to Present Annual Sheep-to-Shawl

WESTFIELD - On Sunday, April 21, children will sing "Bah, Bah Black Sheep, Have You Any Wool?" at the Annual Sheep-to-Shawl Festival at the Miller-Cory House Museum, located at 614 Mountain Avenue in Westfield. The festival will be held from 1 to 4 p.m. and will take place rain or shine.

Visitors will have an opportunity to see the entire process of shearing sheep, as demonstrated by master sheep shearer Jeremy Mills of Hamilton Square, using hand shears as was done in the 18th and 19th centuries.

The sheep will be provided by Beverly Eaton and members of the 4-H Club of Somerset County. Attendees will witness the production of

woven cloth from woolen fibers, which include carding, spinning and weaving.

Youngsters will be able to try their hands at such 18th-century activities as carding wool, using a drop spindle, butter churning, wash day, candy making and saddle cleaning. There will also be children's games and a scavenger hunt.

A bake sale will be conducted throughout the afternoon, featuring a variety of homemade pies, cookies, breads and cakes. Lemonade and homemade cookies will also be available for visitors to enjoy in the Frazee Building, for a small fee.

The museum's gift shop is stocked with educational materials, Colonial reproductions and handicrafts. There are also cookbooks for sale, including several prepared by members of the Miller-Cory Cooking Committee.

There will be no fee for the Annual Sheep-to-Shawl Festival. However, any donations to the Miller-Cory House Museum to support its educational programs will be welcome.


