## Local Red Cross Chapter To Conduct CPR Courses

WESTFIELD - Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) for the Professional Rescuer classes will be offered at the Westfield/Mountainside Chapter of the American Red Cross.

This life-saving course is intended for individuals who have a duty to respond to emergencies, such as life-guards, medical personnel, health club staff, camp directors and emergency workers.

It will cover caring for and recognizing breathing and cardiac emergencies, and CPR for infants, children, adults and the two-person rescue. The course will also include certification in AED (automated external defibrillation) use.

Two classes will be offered. The first will be on Saturday, May 11, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m., and the second will be held on Tuesday and Thursday, June 4 and 6, from 6 to 10:30 p.m.

Also offered will be re-certification classes for this level of CPR. The class will be open to individuals who hold a current CPR for the Professional Rescuer certification but need to renew it (certifications are only valid for one year).

The chapter will hold four of these classes. They will be held tonight, Thursday, April 18, from 6 to 10 p.m.; Tuesday, May 7, from 6 to 10 p.m.; Tuesday, May 21, from 6 to 10 p.m., and Tuesday, June 18, from 6:30 to 10:30 p.m. Participants need only attend one of these dates.

All training sessions will take place at the American Red Cross Chapter House, located at 321 Elm Street in Westfield. Advance registration is required and space is limited.
