# JCC Club 40 Thumps JCC Mermaids, 26-14

In a rematch of last year's JCC men's softball league playoff finale, Club 40 earned their redemption, defeating the defending champ Mermaids, 26-14.

Club 40 recorded runs in seven innings, while the Mermaids weren't close behind with six innings. Still, Club 40 manufactured 10 runs in the first three innings and 11 in the final three innings.

The top of the second for Club 40 started with a leadoff homerun trot for co-captain Mitch Aronson. Aronson finished the game with three RBI, a homer, triple and single.

In the next inning for Club 40, Bill Swersky hit a long-ball himself, which gave way to later inning run-support in the form of a two-RBI double by Gary Schaefer and Aronson. Swersky finished 3-for-4, and just a single short of the cycle.

That homerun in the third by Swersky was the third of the game. In the first inning, the Mermaids put their first two runners on base then watched in delight as Craig Damast blasted a three-run homerun. Damast finished a triple short of the cycle, with five RBI and two runs scored.

Down 10-8 in the fourth, the Mermaids began to feel the pressure of an early playoff exit. Great hustle by Jeff Warsh earned him a spot on first base and Gary Redfield later lashed an RBI single to push the Mermaids within one, the closest they'd get to catching Club 40.

The "Club's" fifth was another offensive showcase as Doug Gincel hit a two-RBI double and Schaefer slapped an RBI double. Schaefer finished 3-

for-5 with four RBI. Gincel was 3-for-5 with three RBI and two runs.

The Mermaids mustered one run in its half of the fifth, but were able to add three runs in the sixth. Ron Oronstein hit an RBI-single and Redfield followed with a two-run triple.

The Mermaids final run came in the seventh thanks to a Jeff Hoffman sac-fly. Oronstein and Redfield, the bottom of the order hitters, combined to go 7-for-7 with four RBI. The last five hitters that included Warsh, Rick Schichonick and Ross Mehلمان combined for 13 hits, while the top seven hitters amassed just 11.

Adding insult to injury, Jeff Mazen (2-for-4, 3 RBI) rocked a two-run homer after Mike Helfand hit an RBI-double. That pushed the score to 23-14.

The final score was much due to the poor outfield play of the Mermaids in the final few innings, including a costly ninth-inning error that cost them two runs.

Club 40 advanced to the next round of the playoffs on Sunday. Co-captain Aronson was a bit concerned about his team's chances in the playoffs.

"It's going to be hard. All the teams are about even. Whoever wins will earn it," he said.

Co-captain Kaufman predicted, "As long as we come to hit, we'll win," he said.

since they had just scored two runs, and had other runners on base.
