Rev. James J. Driscoll, 85, Had Served As Air Force Chaplain For 20 Years

The Reverend James J. Driscoll, 85, of Sea Girt died on Thursday, July 25, at Meridian Nursing and Rehabilitation Center in Red Bank.

Born in Bayonne, he had lived in Westfield before being ordained as a priest on June 19, 1943. He resided in the Sea Girt and Spring Lake area for the past 30 years.

He served for nine years at St. Thomas the Apostle Church in Bloomfield, until 1952. He spent the next 20 years as a chaplain in the United States Air Force, where he attained the rank of

lieutenant colonel.

Reverend Driscoll's military career spanned the Korean Conflict and the Vietnam War. He served at bases in Alaska, Korea, Japan, France and Turkey before retiring from the Air Force.

He subsequently became an associate priest with several churches, including De La Salle Hall at Christian Brothers Academy in Lincroft; St. Catharine's Parish and St. Margaret's Parish, both in Spring Lake; St. Mark's Church in Sea Girt; St. Denis Church in Manasquan and the Immaculate Conception Korean Catholic Church in Eatontown.

He attended Seton Hall University in South Orange and the Immaculate Conception Seminary for the Diocese of Newark.

Reverend Driscoll was a member of the Deal Country Club and the Knights of Columbus.

He was a longtime benefactor of the Immaculate Conception Seminary in Conception, Mo. and the Poor Clare Sisters of Kokomo, Ind.

He was predeceased by two brothers, Daniel Driscoll and Reverend John Driscoll.

Surviving is a sister, Dorothy H. Driscoll, and two nephews.

The funeral service was held on Monday, July 29, at the O'Brien Funeral Home in Wall. A Mass of Christian Burial followed at St. Mark's Roman Catholic Church in Sea Girt. Interment took place at St. Catharine's Cemetery in Sea Girt.
