Vintage Neshanock Squeeze Past Resolutes, 14-13, in 11th

The Elizabeth Resolutes and Flemington Neshanock Base Ball (two words in the 19th century) Clubs sweated out an 11-inning, tension filled 1873 rules match at Echo Lake Park in Mountaintop on August 11. The Neshanock team scored a run in the top of the 11th to edge the Resolutes, 14-13.

The men from both clubs demonstrated a high level of proficiency at this barehanded version of our national pastime. The game was error free through the first four innings as another of these two clubs' trademark tooth and nail contests developed.

The game was also covered by News 12 New Jersey, adding to the fun. Timely hitting by Andy Singer and spectacular defense by Steve Hingel wasn't quite enough to push the Resolutes past the Neshanock,

who have won five of seven contests between the two clubs this year. Captain Bradley Shaw of the Neshanock pitched the entire 11 innings and drove in the winning run in the top of the 11th with a classic 1873 rules fair-foul hit - A batted ball is judged fair or foul by where it first touches the ground in this version of base ball.

The pitcher's point is a flat surface 45 feet from home plate and the ball is delivered underhanded with no limitation on the speed. Both clubs are members of the Vintage Base Ball Association, consisting of about one hundred clubs around the country.

The Elizabeth Resolutes will host the Brooklyn Atlantics this Sunday, August 18 at Echo Lake Park near the flagpole at noon. Spectators are welcome.

Williamson Brothers Finish In Ironman Competition

Three triumphant brothers from local towns crossed the finish line arm-in-arm after completing the grueling Ironman USA Lake Placid race on July 28. Blades, Luke and John Williamson finished the 2.4-mile swim, 112-mile bicycle ride and 26.2-mile run in 15 hours 47 minutes and 54 seconds, together.

The brothers encouraged each other and stuck together through the sweltering heat. "The support and camaraderie my brothers provided made a huge difference," said Blades.

The only time the group had a hard time sticking together was during the swim. "With 2,000 people wear-

ing the same black wet suits, it was hard to stay together, but we just waited for each other at the end of the swimming so we could do the biking and running together," Blades said.

Around the seventh mile of the run portion, Luke's previously injured back began to become a problem. "The time was totally inconsequential; we were really focused on finishing together. We made it a huge victory for all of us," said Blades.

Cindy Williamson, wife of Blades, said, "What was so awesome was that most people competing in this

level of athletics really want to go for time. They just decided to go together. Everyone in the audience was weeping because it was so moving."

Blades is a Westfield resident, father to three girls and coach of the Westfield Wave, a soccer team that has won the Westfield Cup for two consecutive years. This was his first Ironman.

Luke, a Scotch Plains resident and father to a daughter and son, is a veteran triathlete. He competed in the Lake Placid Ironman in 1999 and 2000. This year it was special because he was with his brothers. "It was a lot more fun to do it with my brothers," Luke said.

John, a ski instructor in Aspen, CO, came to Westfield to visit and compete this year. He willingly joined his brothers in this feat, his first Ironman.

prevent Cableman Frank Pepe from scoring.

Power man Karl Grossmann led Comcast, going 3-for-3 with an RBI double and a triple, and three runs scored. Bill Mirto plopped three singles, scored once and had an RBI, and Pepe went 2-for-3 with an RBI and a run scored.
