Westfield B'ball Blue 10s Win New Providence Green Crown

The Westfield 10-year-old Blue baseball team won the New Providence Green League Championship on July 31 by defeating Basking Ridge White, 7-3. The Westfield Blue's success featured strong pitching, outstanding defense and some timely hitting.

Justin Schwartz (4 innings, 5 Ks) and Michael Greco (2 innings, 0 runs) led the pitching effort as the two combined on a four-hitter to stop the No. 1 ranked Basking Ridge team. First baseman Josh Solomon and second baseman Nicholas Polak displayed some dazzling defensive plays. Offensively, Zack Laporta smacked two hits and had an RBI and Mike Kardias and Nicholas Polak powered two RBI each.

The game began with both opposing pitchers in command; however, Westfield broke through in the second inning with a five-run rampage. Ian MacKenzie singled and LaPorta

followed with an RBI double. After Ben Mooney singled and Brian Maehl walked, Polak pounded a two-run double. Mike Kardias then thumped a two-run triple.

The heavy-hitting Basking Ridgers began to chip away at Westfield's 5-0 lead, scoring two in the second and one in the third, but Schwartz and Greco slammed the door shut the rest of the way.

Entering the fifth, leading 5-3, Westfield pushed across a run. Solomon and Patrick Sabatino both walked to lead off the inning. Solomon then scored on Greco's RBI single.

In the sixth, Westfield earned an important insurance run by playing "small ball." Polak led off with a walk, stole second and advanced to third on a fielder's choice. Westfield then executed a suicide squeeze as Schwartz laid down a perfect bunt and Polak slid under the tag.
