trigger with an RBI double and Nick Norton whizzed an RBI sacrifice. The Sheriffs answered with two runs on Walker's RBI double and Grady's RBI sacrifice then Westfield responded in the second when Padovano cracked a double to right, Jim McCullough singled and Joe Czarniecki scored Padovano.

Heavy gunfire echoed across the field in the third. Smalls triggered a five-run assault by punching a single and advancing on a passed ball. Norton knocked an RBI single. Wyman clocked a single and Voom zoomed a two-run triple to center. Next, Padovano lit up the sky with his two-run blast. The Sheriffs re-

turned rapid fire with three runs on a Barnes homer, a Mike Powers double and RBI off the sticks of Darryl Warner and Grady.

The smoke cleared somewhat until the top of the fourth, when the Westfield force stormed across the plate with four runs. Wyman tripled and Voom cracked an RBI sacrifice. Confusion beset the umpire on a "safe," or "out," call when Padovano drilled a hot shot up the middle; then on the relay, the first baseman chucked the base back about seven feet. Meanwhile, the fleet-footed Padovano streaked across the vacancy. Composing himself, Padovano was declared safe by Blue. McCullough followed with an RBI double and Moffett banded his two-run homer out of the park.

Westfield added its final run in the sixth when Belford tripled and Tracey tapped an RBI sacrifice. In a "we'll never surrender" effort, the Sheriffs tallied three runs to close the score at 13-8.

"We're really savoring this moment," said a happy Padovano. "This team is about everybody, when one guy goes down, there is always someone to pick him up. We knew we had to come out swinging, hit singles, because basically we are a singles-hitting team, and we did. It was a team effort and everyone contributed."


