

## Blue Marlins Shatter Records In Victory Over West Caldwell

The Westfield Blue Marlins swim team defeated talented West Caldwell on July 3. The Marlins captured 32 first places and shattered five team records.

Chris DeLaFuenta (12U) swam a personal best to win the individual medley. Pam Wilson and Vincent Shen won their respective individual medley races. Also placing in the IM were Alexi Kuska, Danielle Heffernan and Dan McGrory.

The 8U freestylers also had a personal best but first place eluded them. Lizzie Stellar and Tim Walsh finished second and Amanda Adsit, third. Stephanie Albright and Catherine Green finished first and third, respectively, in the 9-10 free. Adam Metz (9-10), Kuska (11-12), Kirsten Selert (13-14) and Joshua Schoenfeld (15+) also recorded victories. Stephanie Albright set a team record in the 25-meter fly with a winning time of 16.59. Westfield dominated the fly events with victories by Steller (8U), Meserole (9-10), Reyes (11-12), Peeler (13-14), Fowler (15+) and Heinen (15+). Meghan Myers, Trinkle, Walsh, Becky DeLaFuenta, Clark, Kate Young, Wilson, Tim Dohm, Fallon and Gurdus also collected fly points.

Westfield captured five of seven relays. The (12U) girls of Young, DeLaFuenta, Albright and Kuska broke the free-relay record with a time of 1.03.90.
