Chupko helped his cause and stunned the fans when he grabbed a grounder by speedster Tom McGall and beat him to the bag at first. Saints centerfielder Tom Reade made several fine catches and Saints first baseman Terry Gallagher extinguished a potential rally in the ninth inning by smothering a line drive and stepping on first to complete a double play.

The Angels took a 1-0 lead in the top of the first when Lonergan lashed his double to right-center and scored on pull-hitter Joe Shea's single to left. The Saints screamed immediately with three runs in the bottom of the inning. Perconte and Ulichny both singled and Woodring reached on a pitcher's throwing error that sailed out of play and permitted Perconte to scuff home plate. Reade followed with an RBI sacrifice fly to left and Stratton brought Woodring home with a ground out to second. Shaub, Loblance and Matt Fugett

all singled to load the bases in the second then Steve Ferro calmly received a walk to bring home Shaub and to bring the Angels to within one run. Then in the fifth, Gordon walked his two-run homer to give the

JCC Marauders Maul JCC Mermaids, 18-10

The JCC Softball League ended the regular season July 21, with an important preview of a likely playoff match up in the upcoming weeks. The potentially first-place Marauders rode a large and late rally past last year's defending champs, the Mermaids.

On the strength of a six-run seventh, the Marauders pulled ahead, 18-10, and it was too much for the Mermaids to overcome. The Marauders scored early, often and consistently against their rivals.

Their first inning deflated the opposition. Mark Friedman and slugger Dave Heiden both walked, Neal Leitner ripped an RBI double then Jeff Silverstein smacked a tremendous sacrifice fly to center that brought in both Heiden and Leitner. Ray Yarussi, Adam Schaffer and Marshall Feldman kept the rally going with a base hit apiece. Mermaid pitcher Ron Redfield could only get out of the inning by getting a well-hit force out from David Livingston.

The Marauders continued their early dominance in the Mermaid half of the first, when Friendman and second-basemen Tom Lopez completed an impressive double play off a hard shot by Mike Kalen. Undaunted, the Mermaids came back strong in the third. "Marvelous" Marv Scherb, who went 3-for-4 with an RBI, rapped a solid base hit. Gary Bachman walked and Jeff Warsh, Gary Steinfeld and Ron Orenstein all collected RBI singles to tie the game at four.

The Marauders never let the Mermaids take the lead, and answered loudly in the fourth, with the thunderous three-run homerun off of Heiden's bat. They continued the run production consistently for the final innings, culminating with the six-run seventh.

The middle of the Marauder lineup was murderous. Cleanup hitter Leitner went 2-for-2 with a walk and an RBI. Yarussi went 3-for-3 with an RBI, Schaffer went 2-for-2 with two RBI, and Feldman went 3-for-3 with two RBI. Their selectivity at the plate was a major aspect of the Marauders'

offensive strategy. They drew 10 walks as Redfield seemed to struggle with the arc pitches. Co-Captain Todd Krell walked twice as did Friedman.

The Mermaids battled but could not generate enough base runners. Scherb's plate day was impressive, and he sparked defensively in left, robbing Friedman in particular in the top of the fourth. He had five putouts. Steinfeld went 3-for-4 with a triple and two RBI. Jeff Elbaum went 2-for-4 with a triple and an RBI. Russ Mehlmann was the surprise at the end of the order, going 3-for-4 with two RBI. Although doing well, Bachman would have had a great day if Leitner hadn't made an amazing, stretching grab of his mammoth shot down the left-field line in the fourth that could have resulted in three runs.

Leitner was happy with his team's thorough performance, and its chances in the upcoming playoffs.

"We won the game defensively. We had timely hitting. It was our best game, outfield and infield, all around. In the playoffs, if we play like we did today, we have a pretty good chance," he said.

The Marauders could have finished in first-place, if CBI2 lost their game yesterday. The Mermaids have reason to be confident in their abilities, as well. They have won two out of the last three championships, and most importantly, they won last year. In addition, due to vacations and other inevitable absences due to this time of year, they were missing their normal three, four and five spots in their lineup. Those players will be returning for the playoffs. So, a begrudging loss might not equal one at all, when it matters most in the upcoming weeks.
