with a .325 average, 23 stolen bases and 56 runs scored.

Senior outfielder Rachel Wagner went 23-for-71 at the plate for a .324 average. She had 19 RBI, 15 runs scored, three sacrifices and four doubles. In her three varsity seasons, she scored 33 runs, had 34 RBI and nine doubles.

Senior Sara Bobertz pitched two games this season and won both. With the bat, she tied for the team lead in sacrifices with four, stole nine bases and scored 17 runs. Senior Erin Corbett went 16-for-60 at the plate (.267 average), tied for third in RBI with 19, scored 14 runs, swiped six bases and had three sacrifices.

Shortstop Nicole DiFabio had a .231 average (15-for-65), had 13 RBI and scored 12 times. Second baseman Jessica Guerriero scored 10 runs, drew 10 free passes, had nine RBI and tapped two doubles. Freshman

sensation Lauren Gelmetti was second in batting with a .453 average (34-for-75), led the team in RBI with 22 and singles with 30 and tied for the lead in sacrifices with four. She also scored 17 runs and stole 10 bases.

received a full scholarship to Rutgers where he played first singles his junior and senior years.

"He was the only nationally ranked player I ever had," expressed Blackman. "Just to see that level of play was a delight. He was incredible!"

This season, the young Raider tennis team finished 17-5 and had several individuals place in the Union County Tournament (UCT). Junior Josh Sanders placed fourth in the UCT at third singles and had the Raiders' best record at 18-5. Sanders also won the team's "Mr. Bagel" trophy plus he was voted MVP. Second doubles partners, senior Jesse Rogowsky and junior Simon Poplyansky, also placed fourth in the UCT. Rogowsky, who will attend Hartford University in the fall, finished 9-6 and Poplyansky, who finished 14-8, was voted MVP for the year and won the team's "Mr. Body Ball" Award. At second singles, sophomore Mike Thompson finished 15-7, placed sixth in the UCT and was also voted MVP for this season.

Sophomore Adam Corbin and freshman Jason Krueger competed at first doubles and finished with respective records of 13-8 and 12-8. Corbin and Krueger were one of 49 teams in the state to qualify for the NJSIAA first doubles State Tournament played on June 1.

Keeping the team focused was senior first singles player Terry Levine, the team Captain. Levine, who finished 6-14, was awarded the Sportsmanship Award this year and will attend American University.

"We depended on him a lot for leadership," said Blackman.

Harry Yang, who also competed at second doubles, finished 3-5. Senior Eric Yang finished 1-2 and will attend Monmouth University in the fall. Eric also was voted the Sportsmanship Award.

"With only three seniors graduating (two starters), the team should be

very competitive next year," said Blackman.

Blackman, who graduated from Bloomsburg State College in Pennsylvania in 1969, began teaching at Coles Elementary School in 1970. Ten years later, he moved up to Terrill Middle School and taught 16 years as a seventh-grade Math teacher then taught Math six years at the sixth-grade level. At the end of this school year, Blackman will retire and reside in Sarasota, Fla.

"It's a little bittersweet. I'm anxiously looking forward to my retirement. I'll miss being in the classroom and I'll miss coaching. When I get down to Florida, I may still dabble in coaching if I can."

As the sun set upon Municipal Field in Mountainside on June 3, the Chrono's Tavern softball team's season ended with their playoff doubleheader against the third-seeded Springfield Partners in Mountainside Softball League play. Sixth-seeded Chrono's fell victim to the Partners, 21-3, and 12-7.

The Partners pounded four homers in game one. T.J. DelVecchio led the attack by going 4-for-4 with two homers and six RBI. Anthony Palermo also got six RBI, on the strength of three hits. Brian Mullman mashed a two-run homer.

The game was called after the top of the fifth via 12-run rule. Offensive standouts for Chrono's were Phil

Manno, who went 3-for-3, and Hal Breuninger, who had a double and an RBI.

After the break between the two games, Chrono's lineup was reinforced by the addition of Shawn Smith and Greg Hobson; however, once again, the Partners' offense lashed out early by scoring four in the top of the first. This initial spurt was again centered on the hot bat of DelVecchio, who hit a homerun, and ended up going 2-for-3 with two homers and four RBI. Rob Manocchio, who tallied two more RBI, also hit a homer in the first.

Partners' early runs proved to be invaluable as Chrono's battled back strongly in the fourth, fifth, and sixth innings. In the fourth, consecutive doubles by Ray Hurtt, Smith and Breuninger put the team within four runs again, and Sean Kelly kept the rally going with a solid single. Though the next three batters hit into force out's, Kevin Burns' and Dave Augenstein's ground balls produced two more runs that set the score at 5-3.

Although the Partners again broke out for a five-run fifth inning, Chrono's again answered with two runs apiece in the their halves of the fifth and sixth.

It was a bad call, however, that helped to end Chrono's season. After Breuninger made an amazing leaping grab of a line drive by John Fayard, he threw somewhat wildly to Manno at first in an effort to catch a retreating Palermo. Manno clearly got the man in an acrobatic spinning stretch, but the umpire deemed DelVecchio to swing the bat with two outs, and he responded with his second homer of the game, a towering shot that bounced between three speeding cars on Route 22 beyond the left field fence.

Chrono's valiantly struggled to get something going in the bottom of the seventh, with hits by Paul Ewing and Hurtt, but the comeback did not arrive. With Captain Neal Bradley absent, acting Captain Kevin Graney spoke eloquently about the end of the season for Chrono's softball.

"It was a rough season and a tough loss to a good team in the playoffs. We're a bunch of great guys, and we all have fun together. That's what it's all about."

He also alluded to the reason for much of the good feeling surrounding the team. "It's tough to figure out what has risen higher, our weights or our batting averages," he added earnestly.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 1780 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF WESTFIELD CHAPTER 2, "ADMINISTRATION," ARTICLE II, TOWN OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES, DIVISION 3, PERSONNEL POSITIONS AND SALARY SCHEDULE," SEC. 2-12.28, "SCHEDULE."

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town Council of Westfield in the County of Union as follows:

SECTION I.
That the Code of the Town of Westfield be and is hereby amended by revising Section 2-12.28, "Schedule," in Chapter 2, "Administration" Article II, "Town Officers and Employees," Division 3, "Personnel Positions and Salary Schedule," so that the same shall read as follows:
