UC Faculty Members Raise Money for Special Olympics

On Saturday, April 20, a team anchored by Union Catholic High School faculty ran the Jersey Shore Relay from Seaside Heights to Asbury Park to support the Special Olympics. The relay team, led by English teacher Mary Benedetti and physical education teacher Joan O'Donnell, finished 46th out of 200 in the 25-mile race with a time of 3:57, while raising \$650.

Mrs. Benedetti and Mrs. O'Donnell were joined in the race by Mrs. O'Donnell's husband Raymond and Mrs. Benedetti's daughter Jeannie. Mathematics

teacher Jim Johnston was scheduled to be the fifth runner but was unable to run due to a knee injury and was replaced by John Ortiz, class of 2002.

Mrs. Benedetti has a personal connection to the Special Olympics charity. "A friend of our family, Paul Heer, saw his children graduate from Union Catholic. His youngest, David, participated in the Special Olympics. Unfortunately David passed away in a drowning accident last July. The team is running in his memory, a Special Olympian with a connection to the UC family."
