Seeing Eye Puppy Holds Purpose With Westfielder

WESTFIELD - Mother Seton Regional High School in Clark welcomed a special visitor, Garlyn, a Seeing Eye Puppy from Morristown and the pet of Westfielder Annmarie Granstrand.

A freshman at Mother Seton, Annmarie is part of the 4-H Seeing Eye Program. Both Annmarie and Garlyn belong to the 4-Footed Leaders Club in Madison. Garlyn is given basic training and exposure to many things and according to Annmarie, "one of the best environments (and the most fun) is school."

"Garlyn was brought to my house by the Seeing Eye. I will never forget this day," related Annmarie. "It was probably the best day of my life. I was so excited, I had wanted a puppy for as long as I could remember. She came on December 5, 2001. Garlyn was just a small ball of trembling fur and had no idea of what her important mission would be: to become the eyes for a blind person."

Garlyn will only stay with Annmarie for one year, before returning to Morristown to begin her intense training. She will train there for about six months. If she passes

the test, she will become a guide dog and start her training with her blind friend.

Annmarie exposes Garlyn to all types of environments and gives her basic training. The puppy lives with Annmarie under special rules which no ordinary dog would follow. She sleeps hooked up to a chain on the end of Annmarie's bed, just like she would with her blind friend.

Every Saturday morning, Annmarie and Garlyn attend meetings at the 4-Footed Leaders Club. They go on many trips that help expose the puppies to environments which a blind person might visit, so that Garlyn

will know how to act. The club has taken trips to Newark Airport, on mall walks, in parades, on a ferry to Philadelphia, where they toured the aquarium and visited the Liberty Bell.

When Garlyn came to Mother Seton, it was a special experience for the puppy. Annmarie and Garlyn attended homeroom and went on to algebra class, where Garlyn took a nap. On Garlyn's second visit to Mother Seton, she attended all of Annmarie's classes.
