SHAWN COUGHLIN PLACES 3RD AT 217-LB. CLASS Highlander Regenye Gets 2nd At Region 3 Mat Tournament

Governor Livingston High School senior Jon Regenye advanced to the preliminary round of the NJSIAA Wrestling Tournament by placing second in the 154-lb. class at the Region 3 Tournament in Union on March 2. Of the five Highlander wrestlers who qualified for the Region 3 Tournament, only one other, 217-lb. Shawn Coughlin also qualified by placing third.

Regenye obliterated Colin Shallcross of Watchung Hills, via fall in 1:39, in the quarterfinals then dethroned top-seeded Glenn Gross of South Plainfield, 3-1 in the semis, in what Regenye viewed as his biggest victory in his four year career. "I wrestled him in the district finals and he beat me 7-2. He took me down three times with the double leg, so this time I was ready for him" said Regenye. "I was just waiting for him to make a mistake. I kept pushing him until I could find an opening where eventually I got a front headlock which gave me the takedown. This comeback match was big for me. Whether I win this region or not, I've been looking at who is in Region 4, and I think I have a real good shot in making Atlantic City."

In the finals, Vinny Finaidi of Hanover Park scored a takedown while Regenye escaped in the first period. Regenye added an escape and Finaidi added another takedown in the second period to take a 4-2 lead. In the third, Regenye had two escapes and Finaidi had a takedown to win 6-4. Coughlin, known for heart stoppers, outlasted third-seeded Bill Beiermeister of Boonton in the quarterfinals, winning a 1-1 criteria decision in overtime. "He was a little quicker on his feet," said Coughlin. "He picked

Raider Ryan Breznitsky Selected For U.S. Youth Soccer Team

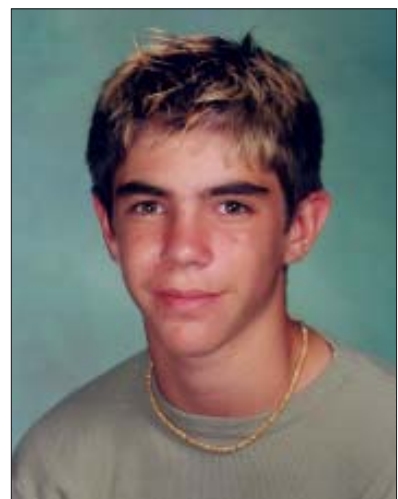
Ryan Breznitsky, a sophomore at Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School, has received the honor of being named to Region I U.S. Olympic Development Soccer Team. The team will compete in the prestigious Mediterranean International Cup in Barcelona, Spain from March 23 to April 1. Some of the other teams competing in the tournament are Brazilian National Select; Florence, Italy; FC Porto; and CSKA Moscow.

Breznitsky, an All-State and All-County midfielder on the Raiders' varsity team, was chosen out of 300 candidates from the 15 states that comprise Region I to represent the United States Region I - 1986 Select

Team. He has been a member of the New Jersey State ODP team for the past three years and plays his club soccer for Players Development Academy - PDA United.

Ryan, who is coached by his father, long time Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School varsity coach, was also chosen to attend the prestigious Adidas ESP (Elite Soccer Player) camp this summer at the University of North Carolina-Wilmington.

The Adidas camp selects only 150 youth and high school players from throughout the country to attend. The camp is fully sponsored by Adidas and staffed by college coaches from across the United States.
