## AAA Honors Westfield Safety Patrol Student

WESTFIELD - Matthew Printz, a fifth grader at Franklin Elementary School in Westfield, is the recipient of a 2002 AAA School Safety Patrol Lifesaving Award, according to AAA New Jersey Automobile Club.

"This is an extremely important honor," explained Michele Mount, Public Affairs Manager for the Florham Park-based club. "In fact, it's the highest honor given to members of the AAA School Safety Patrol program."

A National Review Panel comprised of traffic safety professionals selected this year's recipients. In addition to Matthew, five other patrolers from Ohio, Minnesota and Virginia will be similarly honored. Recipients are selected patrol members, who, while on duty, have saved the life of a person in imminent danger.

Last October, Matthew was at his usual post outside of the school with fellow patrolers and a school crossing guard. Although he was not letting

anyone cross, a fellow student stepped around Matthew and into the street. Matthew immediately grabbed the student's backpack strap and pulled him out of the street just in time to avoid an oncoming car.

In addition to this prestigious national award, Matthew has also been selected as the Club's 2002 Safety Patrolter of the Year and nominated for the first-ever national AAA Patrolter of the Year Award (the winner will be announced in Washington, D.C.). This award recognizes exemplary leadership qualities, safety skills, school involvement and citizenship.

Ms. Mount accompanied Matthew and his family, along with his safety patrol advisor, to Washington, D.C., May 3 to 7, for the award ceremony and related events. While in Washington, he participated in a night tour of the city and the Safety Patrol Parade. The festivities culminate with the AAA Safety Patrol Awards Luncheon on May 7 at the Rayburn House Office Building.
