## Citizens Encouraged to Send Armed Forces Day E-Cards

AREA - The American Legion is encouraging people to show their appreciation to United States military personnel with an Armed Forces Day E-card.

Armed Forces Day, to be observed on Saturday, May 18, was established through the Department of Defense in 1949 to unite citizens and members of the military in support of their country.

The special card, created by the American Legion, may be sent to military members via e-mail.

Anyone interested in sending a card first needs to visit the American Legion's web site, [www.legion.org](http://www.legion.org) and must know the service person's e-mail address in order to send it.

The sender then clicks on the e-card link from the front page, fills in the e-mail information, selects the appropriate branch of service, types in the message and clicks "Send," and the card is on its way to the recipient.

The e-card service is offered free of charge and will be available through Armed Forces Day weekend.

## Union County History Grant Workshop Slated on May 13

Does your non-profit organization have an idea for a Union County history project but needs the funds to implement it?

The Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders announces the Union County History Grant Program, which is made possible by a grant from the New Jersey Historical Commission to Union County's Division of Cultural and Heritage Affairs.

The free workshop detailing how to write a successful Union County History Grant proposal will take place Monday, May 13 at 7:15 p.m. in the Kenilworth Library, 548 Boulevard at 22nd Street in Kenilworth.

"The new history grant program enhances efforts to further promote the County's rich historical legacy," said Freeholder Vice-Chairman Mary P. Ruotolo, liaison to the Cultural and Heritage Program Advisory Board. "Last year Union County awarded funds to ten organizations. The Freeholder Board encourages potential grantees to take advantage of the free technical assistance on how to write award-

winning grant proposals."

This step-by-step workshop will explain how to develop specific components of an effective proposal, including the narrative, project/need statements, budget and publicity plans.

Historical organizations, museums, historic sites, libraries, schools and other non-profit organizations with collections or programming relating to Union County and local history are invited to apply for funding from the History Grant Program.

Funding is available for General Operating Support (GOS) and Special Projects. Specific guidelines and eligibility requirements are described in the application packet, which will be distributed at the workshop.
