

# Westfield School Boosters Association Presents 35th Annual Scholarship Awards to 16 High School Senior Athletes

The Westfield School Boosters Association hosted its 35th All Sports Award Banquet on May 22 at the Westwood in Garwood. This special event is held annually to celebrate and recognize the athletic accomplishments of all the student athletes at Westfield High School (WHS) with special honor given to senior athletes. The event included individual senior plaque presentations, the All Sports slide show, and the Westfield School Boosters Scholarship Awards. The highlight of the evening was the awarding of 16 Booster scholarships each in the amount of \$1,500 to senior scholars.

The "student athlete" scholarships are presented in honor and/or memory of coaches, athletes and "boosters". In addition to the booster association awards, scholarships are donated by "Friends of Westfield Track"; Friends of Girls Lacrosse; Westfield Basketball Association; Taylor & Love Realtors; Mr. and Mrs. Terry Kelly; the family of Louis Kessler; friends of Tom Shields; friends and family of Marge and Bob Brewster; two scholarships in honor of John Byrne, donated by the Byrne Family; and two in honor of Peter Houlihan, donated by an individual booster.

In March, an application was provided to every senior athlete at Westfield High School. A select scholarship committee judged all candidates based upon the information received from the athletes themselves, recommendations of coaches, and the guidance department. Selection criteria consisted of: athletic achievements, scholastic performance and leadership qualities.

The selection task was not easy, however, the scholarship committee made up of fellow booster members George Brucia, Myles Driscoll, Bill Meyer, Jim Nusse, Don Cambria and Rob Albino worked hard to select the following athletes. Athletic Director Ed Tranchina also reviewed the applications.

Tom Hornish, who represented the Friends of Westfield Track, presented the Walter Clarkson Honorary Award in honor of the renowned coach of the Westfield cross-country and track teams to Sarah Mahran. The daughter of Faten and Samir Mahran, Sarah has been a member of the National Honor Society and was captain of the Model U. N. delegation. Additionally, Sarah has been a member of the Kids on the Block, Art Club, Women's Studies Club, and was voted Most Valuable Senior runner. 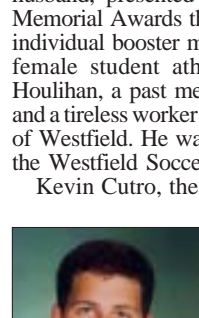

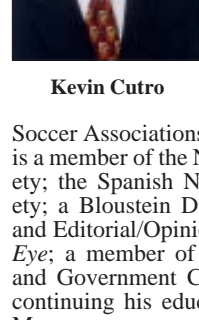
