

## Colonial Love and Marriage To Be Miller-Cory Theme

WESTFIELD - The Miller-Cory House Museum, located at 614 Mountain Avenue in Westfield, will feature "Love and Marriage Colonial Style" this Sunday, June 2, from 2 to 5 p.m.

Joan Barns of Scotch Plains will spotlight the customs, traditions and superstitions surrounding courtship and marriage in 18th-century America. Laurie and Amy Mills of Fanwood will prepare seasonal foods over the open-hearth fireplace in the Frazee Building, using authentic early American recipes. Visitors will be able to sample taste treats prepared by the cooks.

Tours of the museum will be conducted by volunteers, who will discuss Colonial-era living in the West Fields of Elizabethtown. The last tour will begin at 4 p.m.

Admission to the museum is \$2 for adults, 50 cents for students and free for children under age 6.

## Westfield Historical Society Reveals Oral History Tape

WESTFIELD - "I Remember When" will be the theme of an early 1977 oral history tape at the First Wednesday Luncheon of the Westfield Historical Society at noon on June 5 at B.G. Fields Restaurant, 560 Springfield Avenue in Westfield.

This oral history tape will feature an audio interview of Dr. Charles Hely by his long-time friend, William H. Gordon, and the remembrances by Dr. Hely of his early years in a more rural Westfield.

Mr. Gordon introduces himself in the beginning of the interview and relates some of his own history in Westfield. He then starts his interview with Dr. Hely, who reminisces about topics such as trolley cars, Lincoln School, hunting and trapping and life during the Depression.

"This tape is just one of over 50 that were done of residents who had lived in Westfield 50 years or more," said Bob Miller, Program Chairman. "They were compiled by an Oral History Group of the Westfield Historical Society in the late 1970s and early 80s, and a copy of each was sent to the Westfield Memorial Library and the Society's archives. The interviewers were all leading local historians such as Ralph Jones, Jessie Plant Brown, as well as William

H. Gordon and others who were able to get the most out of the interview. There are interesting historic interviews with township officials, such as mayors Charles P. Bailey and H. Emerson Thomas, but most are with average citizens who tell of their personal recollections and the events that occurred during their lives in Westfield."

Mr. Miller said, "I believe most of the Society's members, as well as the general public, would like to hear more of these oral history tapes. Dr. Hely and William Gordon are no longer with us, but through their interview, many of their memories are. My hope in presenting the program is that the audience will sit back, relax, and picture an earlier time in Westfield, as told by Dr. Charles Hely."

### Y Program Prepares For Certification Exams

WESTFIELD - The Westfield Y, located at 220 Clark Street, will hold an ACE (American Council on Exercise) exam preparation program for the Certified Group Fitness Instructor Exam and Personal Trainer Exam.

Participants will meet with other fitness professionals to study weekly for the certification exams.

Personal Training Instruction will meet on Thursdays, from 7:15 to 8:15 p.m., starting on July 11.

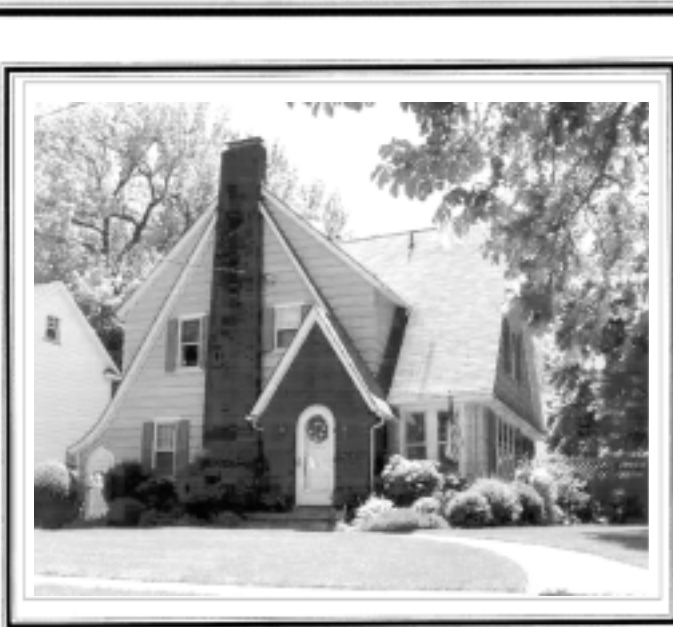
