MCMANUS NETS WINNER, SCHULTZ ADDS INSURANCE

Blue Devil Soccer Boys Plant Farmers, 2-0, in NJ Sections

"One of our outside halfbacks is going to score the winning goal," said Westfield High School boys soccer Head Coach George Kapner prior to the North Jersey, Section 2, Group 4 game with Union on November 8 in Westfield. When the game was over, third-seeded Westfield had defeated sixth-seeded Union, 2-0.

Junior outside halfback Matt McManus settled a deflection off Billy Schoenbach after a cross into the box from sweeper Brendan Egan and tapped the ball into the lower right corner of the net 13.30 into the second half for the winning goal. Senior striker Billy Schultz added

the insurance when he converted a direct kick from 30 yards out with 13:19 remaining.

After acknowledging Kapner's prediction, McManus described, "It was a cross and I came across the middle. Billy Schoenbach was running after it and it just got by him. I stuck my foot out and it went in. I haven't scored all season. Everyone was hoping that I would get one in when I got a chance. I didn't even think about it, I just directed it in."

"Before the game, I told each group of kids, including both sets of outside halfbacks, was to stay wide and crash the goal on the weak side. Be in position and do the right thing," explained Kapner. "And they scored."

The Blue Devils missed several scoring opportunities in the first half and out-shot the Farmers, 6-3. One opportunity in particular, Alex Barrett, Matt Sofka and Billy Schoenbach penetrated deeply into the box. Schoenbach took two close-range shots and the second one rolled

inches in front of the goal where keeper Jim Axelrod, who finished with 10 saves, pounced on it followed by Sofka, Schoenbach and Barrett.

Moments later, Dan Lynes brought the ball down the left sideline and looped a perfect cross to striker Ben Masel who ripped a shot toward the upper center of the goal where Axelrod managed to bat it over the crossbar.

If Westfield held a slight edge in the first half, it was all Blue Devils in the second half. Westfield seemed to have renewed energy and the Farmers appeared a bit hesitant.

Kapner pointed out, "Our subbing was one reason and we were able to tell the team how we wanted to play in the second half. In the first half, both teams had a lot of energy and I thought we were able to maintain our energy and put the ball back on the ground, which we didn't do in the first half."

"Everyone realized that it was now or never," added McManus. "If we didn't do something, our season was going to be over. We out-hustled them. Everyone did. Our defense played really well."
