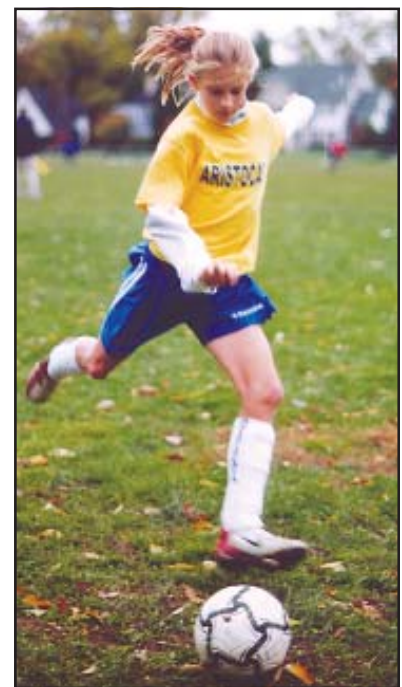
U14 Blue Devil Girls Defeat Cranford Soccer Comets
