Fanwood-Scotch Plains YMCA (FSPY) boys swim team was edged, 105-100, by Lakeland Hills YMCA, on November 2 in an exciting meet.

FSPY had a strong showing in the individual medley. Peter Livolsi took first for the 9-10s with 1:21.07, and Daniel Livolsi's 1:09:08 placed first for 11-12's.

In the freestyle, FSPY dominated. Greg Baliko touched first for 8-and-unders. For 9-10s, Ryan Cleary's 33.14 took first in the 50-yard free and Jonathon Feeley (11-12) touched first with a time of 27.83. James Livolsi (13-14) placed first for 100 free with 54.93.

In the 100 breaststroke, (13-14) Marino easily grabbed first at 1:06:76. (15-18) Eric Swenson placed second in the 200 breast at 2:19:15.

Venezia had a great punt return to the Summit 26 yard line. Michael Henry ran the ball hard, and Sean Ferro scored an 11-yard TD on a pitch from Boyd.

Defensesmen Joe Simone and Lawson broke up Summit pass plays. Harbaugh made a great tackle on a double reverse. Shaw added a quarterback sack. Danny Nuber and Jimmy Ponce made key tackles and Simone added an interception.

After a Summit punt gave Westfield the ball on the Hilltopper 10, Boyd, behind the blocking of Erik Anderson, Greg Greiffeld and DaVon Wise, hit Venezia on a swing pass for the touchdown.

Jared Vassallo, Bryan Krichilsky, Will Uhr, Brendan Galligan and Satya Tagat also helped preserve Westfield's sixth shut out of the season.
