Transportation Historian To Give Talk to Society

WESTFIELD — "The New Jersey Transportation Heritage Center in Progress" will be the topic of a slide lecture presentation by transportation historian, author and publisher Captain Bill McKelvey at the general meeting of the Westfield Historical Society tomorrow, Friday, November 15, at 7:30 p.m.

The meeting will be held at the Community Room of the Westfield Municipal Building, 425 East Broad Street.

Captain McKelvey's career in railroading, along with his avid interest in New Jersey transportation and its history, motivated him to chair the movement for a New Jersey Transportation Museum and Heritage Center.

The purpose of the center will be to "preserve both the images and the artifacts of New Jersey's proud and irreplaceable canal, railroad and roadway transportation heritage by acquiring photographs, archives, documents and structures; restoring and operating historic locomotives, railcars, buses, trucks and other transportation equipment."

A 26-page Master Plan was initiated about 15 years ago and the "Friends of the New Jersey Railroad and Transportation Museum" was formed in 1990 to include all surface common carrier modes of travel.

The museum has now begun to take shape on 35 acres in Phillipsburg. Many historic methods of transportation, as well as donated materials, artifacts and archives, have already been acquired and plans for more donations are in place.

Captain McKelvey was a Senior Railroad Specialist with CIGNA Property and Casualty Companies, Loss Control Services, from 1963 to 1995. He was an independent Loss Control Consultant in railroad, rapid transit and light rail from 1996 until his retirement in 1998.

A member of many transportation and historic societies, he has been a Life Member and Director of the Canal Society of New Jersey since 1975. The author of several books, he also has his own publishing company, "Canal Captain's Press."

The event is open to the public. Light refreshments will be served at the end of the program.

Regional Board of Health To Hold Flu Shot Program

WESTFIELD -- The Westfield Board of Health will be sponsoring a Flu Inoculation Program on Monday, November 18 from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. at the Westfield Municipal Building in the Court Room located on 425 East Broad Street in Westfield. The program is open to residents of Fanwood, Garwood, Mountainside, Roselle Park, Springfield and Westfield.

Flu inoculation is strongly recommended for anyone 50 years or older; people with long term health problems

such as heart, kidney, lung and metabolic diseases; asthma, anemia or other blood disorders; anyone with a weakened immune system due to HIV/AIDS, or other diseases that affect the immune system; or anyone in close contact with people at risk of serious influenza.

Participants will be taken on a first come/first serve basis. Anyone covered by Medicare-Part B, Aetna/US Healthcare or Horizon BC/BS of N.J., should bring their insurance cards. For more information, call (908) 789-4070.

Can I sue a municipality, county or the State if I am injured due to a dangerous condition on public property?

Answer:

The law is more stringent against municipalities and public entities and you must file a Notice of Claim within ninety (90) days of the accident. Generally, a more serious injury is required against a public entity.
