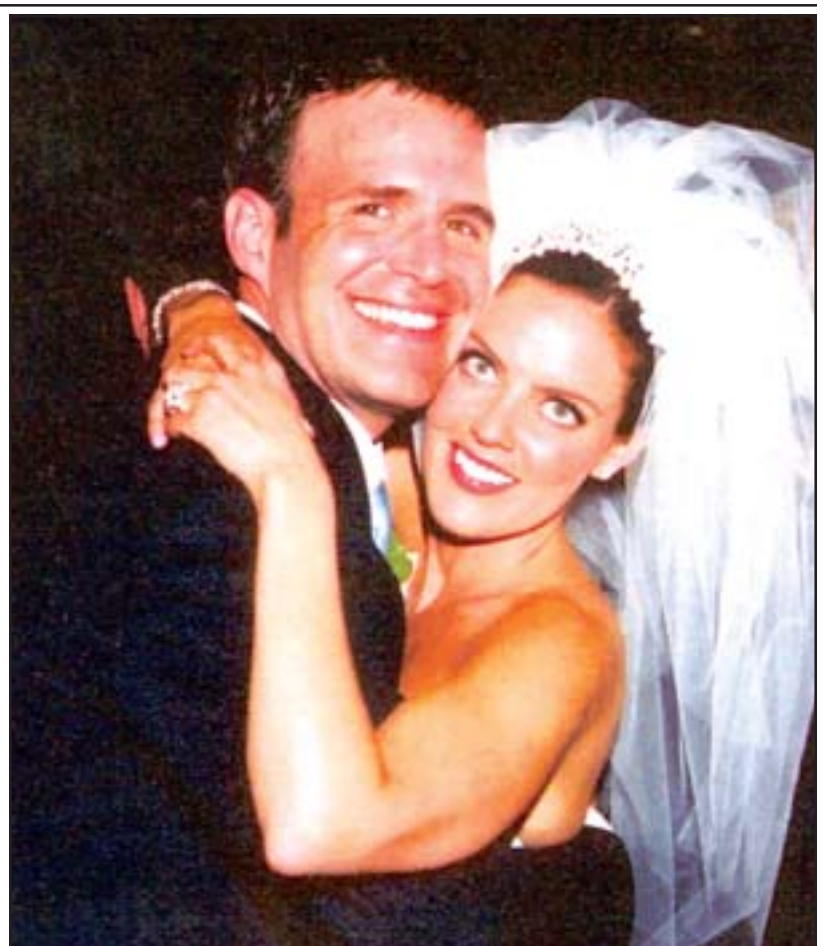
People For Animals Adoption Event Set
