Lady Blue Devils Poke Hockey Farmers, 5-0

The Westfield High School girls' field hockey team, (2-4-2) is improving all the time, as they downed the Union Farmers (4-4-1) with a 5-0 grounding in Westfield on Thursday, October 3. Senior forward and Captain Alexandra Maus shelled the Farmers with four goals and forward Tammi Dondiego struck for one.

The Blue Devils spent the entire game shelling the Farmers from every direction with a barrage of 25 shots.

"Keep the ball out of the goal is our defensive concept and put the ball in is our offensive concept," snickered Blue Devil Head Coach Maggie McFadden before tip-off. "We've been getting the ball into our opponents circle and taking the shots on goal, but we haven't had somebody who finished the shot and really got it into the goal."

Obviously, somebody was listening to McFadden. "They played really well, they ran to the ball, moved and passed well and they finally finished," McFadden pointed out. "So I guess I found a little finisher here in Alex Maus, scoring four goals. She really did a nice job, she was in the right place at the right time and she was able to put the ball into the goal. Not having our starting goalie here today, I needed to be sure that we gave Nicole Zubizarreta a good shot at keeping us in the game. She did. She made good decisions when she needed to. We needed to play defense by attacking. We did that and kept the ball in their end. That was our plan and it worked. It was a total team effort, they really played well together."

13 plays later when Cocozziello rolled right and hit Butts in the endzone with 4:15 left in the first quarter. Andrew Lessner added the point after.

"Pretty much, the whole game I was getting behind the cornerback. I told Jan that I will be in the corner and he put it up there," explained Butts.

On the Bulldogs' second series, Pinnix was stuffed twice—one a two-yard loss at the arms of linebacker Pat Daly. The Bulldogs punted but end Bob Wilt partially blocked it and the Blue Devils took over at their own 42. From there, the Blue Devils marched to the eight where Lessner booted a 25-yard field goal that skid over the top of the crossbar with 9:28 left in the half. The drive was highlighted by DeFazio's great, fingertip 33-yard reception.

On the ensuing kickoff, the Blue Devils kept the ball out of Pinnix's hands when sophomore Brad Trzesniowski recovered a fumble. Next, the Bulldogs were again put at a disadvantage when Dowling, on punt coverage, made a cracking tackle at the five-yard line.

Junior defensive end Montel Glasco and DeFazio at safety simply muzzled Pinnix and the remainder of the Bulldogs until the final minute-and-a-half of the game. At the end of the third quarter, the twosome teamed to create another Bulldog fumble when Glasco jarred the ball loose and DeFazio smothered it.

"Montel gave him a nice lick,"

said DeFazio. "We came up with a new defense to stop Pinnix. We put Glasco over center and he ate that kid up," said Tranchina.

"We wanted to get our line more aggressive against their line because we knew they were big and strong," said Glasco. "I was looking around for Pinnix a lot and gave him a couple of good hits."

Late in the final quarter, Lessner, punting from the Westfield 49, bounced the ball out of bounds at the Bulldogs' one-yard line. Bulldog quarterback Jamir Hill hit receiver Moneace Lavoil over the middle. Lavoil hooked down the right sideline until he was chased down at the Westfield 28 by sophomore Tom Del Duca.

Every second counted and Del Duca's saving tackle later proved to be essential. Two plays later, with 1:32 remaining, Hill completed a 24-yard TD pass to receiver Tyrell Green. The Bulldogs attempted an onside kick but Wilt jumped on it. Westfield knelt twice but had to run one play to eat up the clock and prevent Shabazz from getting another chance.

"We came to play. They were tough kids, tough players. We wanted it more than they did," expressed Butts.

"We were not going 2 and 2. We needed to win this game. We came out fired up, ready to play. They didn't," stated DeFazio.

Raiders May Vary 'O' Verses Cougar Gridmen

More emphasis on offensive versatility may be what the Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School football team needs to be triumphant over the Cranford Cougars on October 12 in Scotch Plains. The scrappy and physical Cougar defense will plan to plug up the holes in order to snuff the running attack of Raider senior halfback Kyle Adams.

The Raiders found offensive success in their big, 13-10 victory over Westfield on September 28. Senior linemen Chris Feighner and Shawn Doyle opened big holes for Adams, who rushed for two touchdowns and 103 yards.

"We had to keep pounding and pounding him against Westfield," said Raider Head Coach Steve Ciccotelli. "We may throw a little more against Cranford to keep them honest. We want to be a little more balanced."

Last year, Adams was also quite successful against the Cougars, amassing 124 yards on 17 carries but the Raiders also had an outstanding quarterback, Brian Schiller, and two fine wide receivers, Steve Williams and Ray Williams, who sat the Cougars back on their hind-quarters.

"They are big up front and very

physical," said Ciccotelli of the Cougar line.

Offensively, the Cougars can be dangerous with quarterback Chris Drechsel and speedy running backs Lester Manuyag and Brendan Small. Last week, against Linden, Manuyag had a 21-yard touchdown run and Small came out of the backfield and snagged a six-yard touchdown pass.

"Drechsel does well running a wing-T and both running backs are good," said Ciccotelli.

The win over Westfield was indeed huge for the Raiders. Many times, after such a big win, there is always the possibility of a mental letdown.

"The game is two weeks from the Westfield game. If we played them the very next week, I would be more concerned," answered Ciccotelli. "We talk about it everyday in practice. We put a lot of emphasis and importance on each game."

Ciccotelli added, "Not just do we have to rely on our Tri-Captains but we need good leadership from all of our seniors to get our team focused. We have our work cut out for us."
