SKOLNICK AND SUSSMAN SPARKLE Cougar Gymnasts Chill Blue Devils, 102.1-98.5

Without the services of junior Stacy Osborn, the Westfield High School gymnastics team was at a disadvantage when it hosted a strong Cranford team featuring one of the state's best gymnasts, junior Bridget Murphy, on October 3. The Cougars returned to Cranford with a 102.1-98.5 victory.

Murphy was indeed superb as she won every event and easily won the all-around with a great 36.8 total. Blue Devils Rachel Skolnick and Jessica Sussman both had a fine afternoon and placed 1-2 in the all-around with respective totals of 33.7 and 32.6.

Murphy performed a very difficult half-on-full back Tsukahara (somersault) to earn a 9.35 on the vault. With a series of giant swings and fantastic transfers from bar to bar, she also scored 9.35 on the uneven bars. Featuring a series of back handsprings and a back somersault, she scored 8.85 on the balance beam. Murphy's total on the floor exercises was 9.25.

"She is definitely the best gymnast that I have seen in Cranford since I have been coaching," Assistant Coach Mike Dow said of Murphy.

Skolnick placed second in the vault and on the floor exercises with respective totals of 8.7 and 8.9. On the vault, Skolnick performed a half-on-full twisting dismount. On the balance beam, she tied for third with Sussman with an 8.35 total and on the uneven bars, she had a score of 7.8. Skolnick's beam routine was highlighted by high leaps, back hand-

springs and a front somersault with a half twist.

"Rachel had a powerful day! She was relaxed and confident," exclaimed Blue Devil Head Coach Melissa Greenwald.

Sussman placed second on the uneven bars with a score of 8.35, had a fine score of 8.1 in the vault but seemed to receive a lower than expected score on the floor. Her uneven routine was highlighted by giant swings, powerful transfers and a layout flyaway dismount with a full twist. Sussman hit everything on her beam routine that was highlighted by a back walkover followed by a back handspring, high leaps and a full gainer dismount.

"I was a little disappointed with Jessica's floor routine score; however, she was solid on her other events," said Greenwald.

Kathryn Brucia competed in all four events and had an all-around total of 31.45. Brucia's best score was an 8.45 in the vault where she performed a handspring-full twist. She placed third on the uneven bars with a score of 7.85 and also had scores of 8.35 on the floor and 7.15 on the beam.

"Kathryn Brucia has proved to be a solid part of my starting line up," mentioned Greenwald.

Blue Devil Mika Cruz, performing a smooth handspring, earned an 8.1 in the vault. She also scored an 8.2 on the floor.

"Considering part of my starting line up was absent, our team did a superb job," said Greenwald. "We had a really fun meet and we know there's skills that everyone has to work on, but we know we can pull our score up."
