## Westfield PAL 'B' Humbles Hanover Footballers, 13-0

The Westfield PAL "B" football team handled Hanover, 13-0, on October 6, at Kehler Stadium. Westfield's Eddie Simmons scored all 13 points in the final two minutes.

Westfield held Hanover to one first down for the entire game, an 80-yard run in the first quarter. Westfield defensive end John Dugan, in a determined effort, emerged from the pack and chased down the runner at the one-yard line to save the touchdown (TD). In the goal line stand that followed Westfield's defense stiffened as Dugan and defensive end Joe Vall-Ilobera tackled Hanover runners for losses and cornerback Charlie Read broke up a pass in the end zone. Dugan and Val-Ilobera dominated the defensive line throughout the game. Linebackers Austin Rolnick, Ricky Ruhl and Mike McCreary contributed key tackles and Read made a diving interception on Hanover's first possession.

Offensively, Westfield had some success moving the ball. Quarterback Kevin Neylan and running backs Simmons, Matt Shaffer, Mike Phillips and Ryan Brand had nice runs behind key blocks of Rob Witkowski and Josh Gribbin, however were unable to sustain a drive into the end zone until Simmons ran a left sweep late in the game through a hole created by Brand, Phillips and tight end Patrick Stanley. Simmons sped for a 25-yard TD. The point after was good.

Two plays later, on the final play of

the game, Antonio Santonastaso pressured the Hanover QB and Simmons intercepted and returned it 45 yards for the TD.
