The Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School girls tennis team (11-7) muzzled the Linden Tiger girls, 4-1, in Scotch Plains on October 24. The Raiders got key victories from their reliable first and third singles players and their ever-improving doubles teams.

After losing the first set, Raider first singles player Elizabeth Pilkington shifted the momentum and defeated Micah Hatulan, 2-6, 7-6, 6-1. At third singles, freshman Courtney Burke tamed Tiger Jana Zayets, 6-1, 6-0. Burke controlled her opponent by picking off volleys at the net and served effectively.

"I thought the season was good because I was able to play a lot and I believe my game improved because of it," said Burke. "My strength, I believe, lies with my consistency. I don't have too much power in my hits, but I can place the ball, so I'm really looking forward to a good season next year."

The Raiders' double teams did what they had to do when Ayana Brody and Jessica Binkiewicz (first doubles) combined to defeat Asha Bryant and Barbara Pas, 6-1, 6-2. Shannon Hassett and Sara Van Wagner (second doubles) took care of business shutting out Tiffany Daniel and Krystle Williams, 6-0, 6-0.

"It's been a very good season. We developed some real strong double teams all along the line," explained

Raider Head Coach Sue Allen. "The first doubles team qualified for the state tournament. It went down to a tiebreaker in the first set against the fourth seed."

Allen added, "I believe one of the bright spots this season came in our (second) match against Westfield. They beat us both times but the first doubles teams played three sets with three tiebreakers. So we did much better, score wise, than we did the first time, so that shows me that we had improvement. Our other doubles teams have also gained a lot of experience and next year they are going to be a lot stronger. We have 14 people and even the bottom seven have all played five matches, so we have used everybody. We still have a winning record and it has been a good season."

Raiders first doubles team players, sophomores Joanna Rosenberg and Karina Gotliboy, with a combined record of 10-3, shared their views on the season.

"We are the best of friends and work really well together," said Rosenberg. "We made it to the States and recently played a great match against Westfield. We were excited to be in such a close match that lasted 3:45 long. The season has been a lot of fun."

Gotliboy added, "We placed fifth in the Counties, so we didn't do as well as we would of liked. We were aiming more for third perhaps, but we started out a little slower than we wanted to. In the States we won a close match against Holy Spirit in the first round, then lost against fourth ranked Red Bank."

### Raider Gymnasts Edged By Cougars, 101.9-100.4

The Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School gymnastics team scored its second-highest team total this season but fell short to Union County power Cranford, 101.9-100.4 on October 22. Previously, on October 17, the Raiders had a total of 100.45 in a victory over Union.

Against Cranford, Raider Katie Zaleski placed second in the all-around with a total of 34.0 behind Cougar Bridget Murphy, who totaled 35.5. Raider Taylor Montagna tied for third in the all-around with Cou-

gar Olivia Cathcart at 32.9.

Murphy placed first in the vault with a score of 9.2, first on the uneven bars with a mark of 8.8 and first on the floor exercise at 9.3. She also placed third on the balance beam at 8.2. Cathcart tied for first with Zaleski on the beam with a score of 8.5 and placed second on the floor at 8.8.

Zaleski tied for third with teammate Jackie Tumolo and Cougar Rachel Sigmund in the vault with a score of 8.2. Raider Kate Breuninger placed second in the event at 8.8. Zaleski placed second on the uneven bars at 8.75. Montagna took third on the floor at 8.6 and third on the bars at 8.4.
