Westfield PAL 'A' Pounds Perth Amboy 'A', 32-0

The Westfield PAL "A" football team improved their record to 6-0 with a 32-0 victory over host Perth Amboy on October 27.

Opening on defense, tackles by Ryan Yarusi and Terell Shaw forced the Red Raiders to punt after three plays. Mike Venezia received the punt returned to midfield. On the first play, Tom Bonard, behind the blocking of J.T. Sheehan, Tyrell Simmons, Santo Nardi, Shaw and Will Harbaugh, raced off left tackle for a 50-yard touchdown (TD). Simmons kicked the extra point.

Mice Lawson, Jimmy Ponce, Zach Deegan, DaVon Wise, Satya Tagat, Eddie Kane and Arend Santiago all had tackles as Perth Amboy managed only one first down in the first half. Simmons burst through the line to block a punt and literally took the ball off the punters' foot and raced to the end zone for Westfield's second TD. Nardi kicked Perth Amboy's third

punt and recovered the ball on the Red Raider 24. Venezia then shook a linebacker and raced for a 24-yard TD. Sean Ferro and Jeffrey Mysel had strong runs to start the next scoring drive. Quarterback Mark Boyd completed a long pass to tight end Matt Ince then hit Ferro on a swing pass. Next, Ferro swept right then cut to the left for a 36-yard TD run.

Michael Henry led the final scoring drive. From the Blue Devil 13, Henry broke off a 26-yard gain and then added another six yards. Ferro ran for 10 yards and Mysel raced 16 yards on a pitch from Venezia. Henry followed with a five-yard TD run.

Defensesmen Jared Vassallo, Brendan Galligan and Bonard all made TD saving tackles. Deegan and Jimmy Ponce both recovered fumbles. Scott Dyer, Ben Thomas and Will Uhr sealed Westfield's fourth-consecutive shutout.

Westfield PAL 'B' Thumps Perth Amboy Boys, 25-7

The 5-1 Westfield PAL football "B" team pummeled Perth Amboy, 25-7, on October 27. Westfield's defense forced turnovers that led to the first two scores.

Perth Amboy (PA) opened with three plays totaling 13 yards; however, defensive tackle John Dugan stuffed a Red Raider for a five-yard loss. Next, linebacker Scott Newman intercepted and returned it to the PA 45. Westfield marched to the two on runs by Mike Phillips, Eddie

Perth Amboy fumbled on their first play and linebacker Mike McCrea recovered at the PA 27. One play later, QB Neylan gunned a pass to wide receiver Travis Cassett who outran the defense for a TD.

Westfield's defense held PA to just two yards on the next series. Joe Vall-lobera, Austin Rolnick, Patrick Stanley, Charlie Read and McCrea had hard-hitting tackles. Westfield took over at the PA 37 and drove in for another score on a 12-yard TD run by Simmons. The PAT pass from Neylan to Cassett was good for a 19-0 halftime lead.
