

Blue Devil XC Boys, Girls Place 5th at Magee Meet

The Westfield High School cross-country boys and girls each place fifth overall at the 23rd Bernie Magee Class Meet at Warinanco Park in Roselle on September 21. Freshman Kris Kagan, who crossed second in the 2.2-mile freshman course with a time of 12:44.21, was the only Blue Devil to place in the top-10 in his respective division.

The Blue Devils had a total of 337 and the boys totaled 442. The

girls' best showing was in the senior division where they placed third with a 68 total. They also placed seventh in the freshman division with a total of 340. The sophomore boys placed fifth with a total of 95 and the freshmen A team took sixth at 205 - the B team was 15th at 551 and the C team was 26th at 771. The senior placed eighth at 125 and the juniors placed 16th at 202.

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Plains is a tough team. They have a lot of good players, particularly Stefanie Heath, so I knew I had to watch where she was at all times, making sure she wasn't getting any shots off."

The Raiders retaliated with nine shots on goal and two corner kicks. Keeper, Lauren Bianco registered six saves. "We didn't come out ready to play," explained Raider Head

Coach Kevin Ewing. "We have several inexperienced kids and it showed on the field. Westfield is a very good team. They have a lot of experience and they capitalized on it. Our inexperience shows that we don't know what to do, what the game calls for, allowing teams to take advantage. Then, having numerous players out due to injury and illness makes it even tougher. I told them to keep their heads up, that their first four games would be their toughest."

The Blue Devils scored four goals in the first half, the first coming, when Stacy Spass sailed a shot from 20-yards out to the awaiting Williams, stationed at the far post, who then ripped the right corner at 19:39. Two minutes later, Spass looped a corner shot to Laura Shelman, waiting near the post. Shelman used her head perfectly to butt it in past Bianco.

The assault continued when Danielle Fried and Beth Mokrauer worked well together moving the ball in front of the net. Fried faked and chipped a shot past the fallen keeper to Mokrauer who tapped it in at 34:30. The fourth goal came two minutes later on an assist by Williams who passed the ball into the box to Price Gaynor, who ripped the net.

In the second half, Westfield continued their aggressive play. A Raiders' tripping penalty proved costly when Blue Devil Gio Palatucci delivered a looping pass to Williams who whizzed it across the goal.

"This was our first day back to school after one of our schoolmates passed away and we dedicated this game to Greta," said Williams. "This was great for two reasons, one, Scotch Plains is our big rival; secondly, Greta."

Describing the success of a near perfect defensive game, Ashley Kent said, "As a fullback, I need to bring confidence onto the field, make runs, get down to the corners so they can cross it in and bring support to my team. Our touches and shots were awesome and we were under control. We played with a lot of heart and we took this game very seriously. We have a lot of pride in ourselves so I'm really proud of our team."

The Raiders will concentrate on developing their young team with more playing time and by returning their key players in Lauren Belford, Kristen Zyla and Lauren Perotta from the injury list.
