Westfield P.A.L. 'A' Beats Berkeley Heights 'A', 32-7

The Westfield Police Athletic League's "A" football team had an impressive, 32-7, victory over Berkeley Heights at Highlander Field in Berkeley Heights on September 22. Westfield opened on defense and immediately overwhelmed Berkeley Heights forcing a fumble on the Highlanders' second play. Tyrell Simmons recovered the fumble on the 37-yard line with the help of Jim Ponce and Terrell Shaw. The Blue Devils cashed in immediately. Tom Bonard blasted for seven yards and Ryan Yarusi dashed 30 yards for the touchdown (TD). Westfield blocked a punt and took over on the Highlander 40. Michael Henry rushed for a four-yard gain on a sweep left. Michael Venezia, on a counter-trap handoff from quarterback Mark Boyd, cut into the open field for a 36-yard TD. Bonard added the extra point scampering around left end. Berkeley Heights fumbled again and Simmons recovered. Westfield extended their lead thanks to an outstand-

ing ground-game lead by Sean Ferro and Peter Cornell. The play of the day was a halfback option when Boyd pitched the ball to Bonard who found Peter Antonelli for a 21-yard gain. Yarusi capped the drive with a one-yard TD run. Bonard kicked the extra point for a halftime score of 20-0. Westfield opened the second half with a 65-yard, six-play scoring drive. On four rushes, Yarusi gained 52 yards, including his third TD. Boyd also found tight end Matt Ince for a 13-yard pass completion. The Highlanders scored late in the third quarter, however, Westfield followed that with a 13-play drive engineered by quarterback Joe Simone and the inspired running of Jeffrey Mysel who capped the drive with a six-yard TD run up the middle. Head Coach Pat Ferro was pleased with his team's opening game effort, "It's a great way to set the tone for the rest of the season."

VIKING WHYTTE NETS TWO GOALS Lady Soccer Vikings Tie Highlanders, 2-2, in OT

High-pressure offense and determined defense by both teams resulted in a 2-2 tie after double overtime between the Union Catholic and Governor Livingston (GL) High School girls soccer teams in Scotch Plains on September 18. Allie Whyttle netted both Viking goals while Meridith Talbot and Allie Smith hit the net for GL.

The 2-1 Vikings came out a little flat, but managed to get both goals in the first half. Viking Gwen McGuire came up with 16 saves.

Viking Head Coach Jim Revel said, "We scrimmaged Governor Livingston the first week in September, plus we've seen them all summer in our summer league, so we know what they're all about. Each time, just like today, it's been very, very close and competitive, so it was a real good game."

From the onset, GL (1-1-1) played an aggressive pressure type game and held an edge in possession. Smith scored the tying goal in the second half. The Highlanders took 21 shots on goal and four corners.

"I'm very pleased with the girls, they are a nice bunch and they are playing very well," said GL Head Coach Bill Howard. "It's a good tie for us, although I don't like ties. Union Catholic is a tough team, so now people realize we are a team to be reckoned with."

Talbot scored the first goal at 1:57 but the momentum shifted when the Vikings pressured senior goalie Kathy Dreitlein, (13 saves). Whyttle smoked the ball into the net off of a rebound shot by Rebecca Babicz at 8:23. Less than five minutes later, Amanda Pitts brought the ball down the right side and crossed to Whyttle near the box. Whyttle's header found the left portion of the net at 13:37.

Irwin Bernstein Earns Tennis Bronze Medal

Irwin Bernstein of Westfield earned a bronze medal in tennis in the New Jersey Senior Olympics on September 21 at Brookdale College in Lincroft. Competing in the 65-69 Age Group, Irwin tied for third place by reaching the semifinals in singles.

Bernstein defeated Warren Morrell, 8-2, in a preliminary match and Jun Cortes, 6-0, 7-6 (7-5), in the quarterfinals before losing to Jay Ferrero, 6-1, 6-0, in the semifinals

"I just gave it my 100 percent," said Whyttle. "I just went for it as usual. It's all about giving 100 percent for the team."

During halftime, Viking Assistant Coach Bill White said, "I thought Berkeley Heights really dominated early on and we came alive after giving up that first goal, but I think we made a remarkable comeback. We started to gain possession a little bit more. We want our kids to come out in the second half and keep pressure on the ball and don't give them time, because that's what G.L. works on. They like a possession game, and if you cut down their time, you're cutting down their chances."

GL's break came with 38:00 remaining when Smith zipped a perfect cross past the goalie for the tying goal.

Commenting on GL's solid performance, Talbot said, "We believe in ourselves and we showed a lot of team work. I thought we definitely out-hustled them. We're lucky to have two freshmen that are really helping us offensively. We started out with a tough loss against Ridge, a game that I think we should of won, then we played Immaculata who we downed 8-1, so I think we are really becoming stronger with every game."

GL's Dreitlein added, "We came out here to play this game as hard as we possibly could, because we knew we could play with them. We've been working hard during practice on traps, back and side passes, pass and 'go's, so it just came all together really well today."
