## History and Fun to be Focus Of Harvest Festival Sunday

MOUNTAINSIDE - The 21st Annual Harvest Festival will take place this Sunday, September 29, from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. at the Trailside Nature and Science Center in Mountainside, sponsored by the Union County Board of Chosen Freeholders.

Among the featured activities will be a crafts tent where children can make their own clay pots, school slates, hex signs, bear claw necklaces and beeswax candles.

Youngsters will also be able to have their faces painted Lenape style, play Colonial games, take a pony ride, visit a petting zoo, walk through a hay maze or build a scarecrow.

Various performances will also be presented, including Will Shaw, who will juggle and ride a unicycle; Native American storytelling with Kenneth Little Hawk; marching music by the fife and drum unit of the 4th New Jersey Regiment Continentals; the country/bluegrass tunes of the Fresh Cut Grass band

and a town crier.

Food will also be available, including such Colonial era fare as oyster stew, hopping john and chicken with dumplings, along with treats like funnel cakes, candy apples and ice cream. Pumpkins and mums will be for sale as well.

Admission to the Harvest Festival will be \$3 per person; children ages seven and under will be admitted free. The Trailside Nature and Science Center is located at 452 New Providence Road.

Free parking will be available at Trailside and at the nearby Watchung Stables, located at 1160 Summit Lane in Mountainside. Shuttle bus transportation to and from Trailside to the overflow parking area at the Stables will be provided. The festival will be held rain or shine.
