Giannaci got into the groove and held the Blaisers scoreless for the remaining three innings. In the meantime, St. Al scored its final run in the sixth when Ulichny launched his solo shot to right-center.

The Township of Scotch Plains (hereinafter "Township") shall not be responsible for any bid mailed which is lost in transit or delivered late by the Postal Service. At the above time, the bids will be publicly opened and read aloud. All bids must be presented in sealed envelopes, which are clearly marked, "Bid for Curbside Recycling Pick-Up".
