Free College Course Offered To Union County Seniors

WESTFIELD - The Westfield Senior Citizens Housing Corporation, in conjunction with the Westfield Foundation and the Learning is Forever (LIFE) Center of Union County College, will sponsor classes on its premises during the upcoming fall semester.

Dr. Christopher Gibbs will teach a three-credit course entitled "American Political History." It will begin with a discussion of Progressivism and an analysis of its impact on politics through the first half of the 20th century, then examine the decline of the Democratic Party and the rise of the Republican Party through the 2000 election. Special attention will be paid to the Civil Rights move-

ment, the Vietnam War, the 1960s and Watergate.

This course will be held at 1133 Boynton Avenue on Fridays from 10 a.m. to noon, beginning September 2. The Life Center courses are offered free of charge to Union County senior citizens. Registration will take place the first week of class.
