"I shouldn't have let him get those on me," said Whitney, whose record shifted to 13-3, after the match. "He had a really strong tight waist and he jacked me with it."

Also prior to the 880-yard event, MacNeil earned another eight team points by finishing second in a near photo finish with Governor Livingston's Chrissy McCurdy in the 440-yards. McCurdy edged MacNeil, who crossed in 1:03.7, by one-tenth of a second.

Raider Samantha Gates surprised herself in the 880 by finishing third with a personal-best indoor time of 1:06.

"I totally didn't expect it. I knew I had to run my heart out in the beginning and take it from there. I could have had a better start but I definitely felt strong," said Gates.

Leadoff runner MacNeil, Miriam Becker-Cohen, Erin McCarthy and

anchor Onishi took top honors in the 4x440 relay with a time of 4:25.1. The Raiders finished third with a time of 4:30.8. Blue Devil sophomore Emily Perry took fourth in the high jump with a height of 4'10" and Jen Danielsson finished third in the two-mile with a time of 12:31.7. Raider Kat Berka placed fifth in the shot put with a shove of 30'4.5". Union Catholic's Jenn Seniszyn placed fifth in the 60-yard dash with a time of 7.6.

Raider senior Mary Shashaty passed Stephanie Genna of Union with three laps remaining in the two-mile to finish second with a time of 12:09.9 behind Laura Gallo of Cranford who crossed first with a time of 11:48.8.

GENERAL ORDINANCE NO. 1845 AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF WESTFIELD, CHAPTER 16, "PARKS AND RECREATION" BY CHANGING CERTAIN FEES FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE MEMORIAL POOL AND BY ESTABLISHING CERTAIN NEW MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Town council of the Town of Westfield as follows:

That Section 16-12 "Fees established" be amended to read as follows:

Class of Membership	Resident	Non-resident
1. Family	\$ 278.00	\$ 522.00
2. Family with full time child care	\$ 443.00	\$ 832.00
3. Husband and Wife without children	\$ 225.00	\$ 437.00
4. Individual	\$ 165.00	\$ 310.00
5. Senior Citizen	\$ 70.00	\$ 130.00

SECTION III. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict, or inconsistent, with any part of the terms of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are in such conflict or inconsistent.

SECTION IV. In the event that any section, part or provision of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof, other than the part so held unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION V. This ordinance shall take effect after passage and publication as soon as, and in the manner, permitted by law.
