

TREE TIPS: The Asian Longhorned Beetle By: Martin Schmiede, President Schmiede Tree Expert Company

The Asian Longhorned Beetle Anaplohora Glabrioennie, a native of China and North Korea, has found its way into the United States into Brooklyn, N.Y. and Summit, Illinois in 1996. The beetles apparently came to America in crates and pallets which are used to ship goods from one continent to another. The beetle has no natural predators in this country and it looks like it will be a threat to our shade trees. Woodbridge, Carteret and Rahway have lost about 900 trees and additional trees have been infested. The New Jersey Department of Agriculture has quarantined heavily infested areas and has supervised the removal of the infested trees, stumps and all as it became necessary. Chipping and incineration of the infested wood has been the usual way to solve the

and is destroying trees from

all over its body. The beetle has 2 feelers, so called antennas, about 2 1/2 long, also pitch black and banded with white stripes. Only chemicals injected into the sap-stream are offering any help. 5% Ima-jet systemic injected under pressure into Xylem vascular system or sımılar injected chemicals can save the infested trees. Otherwise they are doomed. Only licensed professional arborists are allowed to inject systemic into the sap stream of a tree.

At first the female Asian Longhorned Beetle gauges small holes into the bark of the target trees in May and deposits eggs into them. Up to 90 eggs can be produced by one beetle in one season and distributed in a 1,200 feet radius. Within 2 weeks the eggs will hatch and the emerging larvae, white in color, digs itself into the vascular tissues of the infected tree. The larvae creates a 3/8th inch hole. Sawdust is usually dropping out of the hole and sometimes liquid is running down the stem from the hole. The larvae will develop into a beetle during the growing season in the tree and over winter in the tree,

ready to emerge in May with wings feelers and all. May is the mating season for the Asian Longhorned Beetle. The grown up beetle, after it has produced a new generation, spends a couple months towards the end of the summer chewing on some branches and perishes.

In the last few years we have experienced the disapperance of the Gypsymoth Catterpillars, the Inch Worms and the Adalgid Wooley Aphids. We just hope that the Asian Longhorned Beetle will disappear the same
