Health Department Posts Schedule For Flu Clinics

WESTFIELD - The Westfield Regional Health Department has announced the dates for two upcoming flu clinics. Vaccine will be given out on a first-come, first-served basis. Medicare eligible individuals are asked to bring their card with them.

The first clinic will be held Tuesday, November 29, from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m. in the Fanwood Municipal Building Council Chambers, 75 Martine Avenue in Fanwood.

A second clinic will take place on Wednesday, November 30, from 7 to 8 p.m. in the Springfield Municipal Building Council Chambers at 100 Mountain Avenue in Springfield.

The following are the priority groups that should receive the influenza vaccine: those age 65 and older, with and without chronic health conditions; residents of long-term care facilities; persons age two to 64 with chronic health conditions; children age six to 23 months; pregnant women; health care personnel who provide direct patient care and household contacts and out-of-home caregivers of children under six months old.

The clinic is open to residents of Fanwood, Garwood, Mountainside, New Providence, Roselle Park, Springfield and Westfield only. Proof of residency will be required.
