Since early September, high school sports have dominated the airwaves, with more than 20 varsity sport competitions being produced for the local television viewers.

"This year we've cablecast most of the high school varsity soccer games," said SPFHS Television Production teacher Bill McMeekan, "We thought it would be great to not only cover a bit of our middle school sports, but also give middle school students the chance to participate in the production."

So in addition to the high school television crew of cameraman Chris Polhemus and announcer Michael Cejovic, additional announcers from each middle school were invited along to help bring all the action to the viewers. "It was a great learning experi-

ence," said Terrill Middle School announcer Adam Offtizer.

Co-announcer Nick Kosciliek from Park Middle School agreed. "It was so much fun," he said, "I'd love to do it again".

"Honestly, they did better than me," said SPFHS announcer Michael Cejovic of his middle school cohorts. "They're probably the best announcers we've ever had on Scotch Plains Television."

Although Park ultimately came out on top on the soccer field, both schools were winners behind the camera.

"For their first time working on a TV shoot, Nick and Adam did a phenomenal job," said McMeekan. "They played a big part in this unique sports presentation. We hope the viewers enjoy their effort."

tough defense by Tony Pafumi, Craig Callahan, Nick Boyle and Matt Buccino kept them from scoring.

Late in the fourth quarter, it looked as though Westfield was going to hold the lead when they caught Summit in a fourth-and-15 situation but Summit's quarterback threw a 25-yard pass into the end zone. The touchdown was capped off with a good kick for two points.
