Abakadoodle Art (18 months to five years): The Twoosy-Doodlers class, 20 to 36 months, will be held from 9:30 a.m. to 10 a.m. and the Mini-Doodlers for ages three- to five-year-olds from 10:15 a.m. to 11 a.m. Both will be held on Wednesdays from October 19 through December 21. (There will be no class on November 23 and December 7). The Doodlers class for grades 1 to 6 will be held on Mondays from October 17 through December 5 from 4 p.m. to 4:45 p.m. The fee for both classes is \$98 per student.

Bowling League (Ages Pre K to Teen): This program is held on Monday afternoons at 3:50 p.m. at the Linden Lanes for all children ages five to 14. Separate Pre K and teen programs are also available. The cost is \$6 per week, payable at Linden Lanes.

Manners Class (Ages four to seven): Offered by Mannerations, this class will be held on Wednesdays from 3:45 to 4:30 p.m., from November 30 through December 21. The cost is \$83 per child.

Total Body Workout: This 60-minute class involves an invigorating warm, toning exercises using light weights. Mats are provided and the program is open to all experience levels. The program is available on Tuesdays from 9:20 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. through November 29. Call the Recreation Department for details.

Stroller-size: This program consists of power walk and body toning exercises using your stroller and your baby. The program is held at Tamaques Park on Wednesdays from 9:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. Call for details.

Microbrewery Tour: This tour and beer tasting will be held at Climax Brewery in Roselle Park on Saturday, November 12. The bus departs the municipal building at 12:30 p.m. The \$30 cost includes gratuities, taxes, a complimentary pint glass, transportation and private tour.

NYC Night Light Tour, Tuesday, December 6. This trip aboard a motor coach features a narrated tour of New York City to see the holiday lights with many popular stops and dessert at New York's Skylight Diner. The cost is \$30 per person. The bus departs Westfield at 6:30 p.m. and returns at 10 p.m.

Haunted House (Monday, October 31, from 5 to 9 p.m.): This annual event features life-size creatures of all types in a uniquely de-

signed Haunted House setting. The program includes a horse-drawn hayride by Kafka Farms of Watchung. Rides will begin at 4 p.m. The fee is \$3 per child. Volunteers 15 years old and up are needed for set design, set construction, painting, and to dress up in costumes. Call Traci Kastner at the Recreation Department if interested.

The Teen Center is open on most Friday evenings in the community room of the municipal building during the school year between the hours of 7 and 11 p.m. for all Westfield High School students. The center features pool tables, ping-pong tables, air hockey, video games, large TV, VCR, stereo system, vending machines and more. Student I.D. is required.

The Night Place program is held throughout the school year on select Friday evenings. The program is open to all 6th, 7th and 8th grade Westfield residents at a fee of \$2 in advance or \$3 at the door. The program is held from 7:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. at Edison Intermediate School. Featured activities include a live DJ with dancing, movies, passive games, and basketball, refreshments will be served. Church to Screen Film On Historic Cemetery

SCOTCH PLAINS - On Sunday, October 16, at 6 p.m., the Scotch Plains Baptist Church will screen a 47-minute documentary about "God's Acre," the historic cemetery that surrounds the church. The public is invited to attend.

Produced by Channel 35 (Fanwood), the documentary highlights the exquisite artwork and touching epitaphs on the headstones, as well as Scotch Plains' connection to historic events. First used in the 1740s, the cemetery is the final resting place of over two dozen Revolutionary War veterans.

Following the screening, the Reverend Chaz Hutchison, Pastor of the church, and George Weiss of Channel 35 will discuss how the documentary came together and answer questions about the cemetery, local history and the film-making process.
